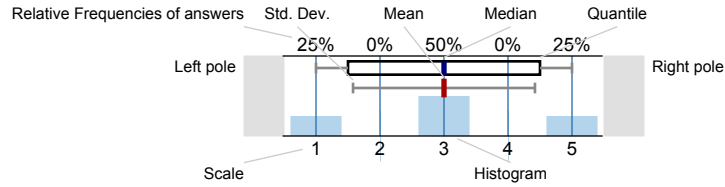

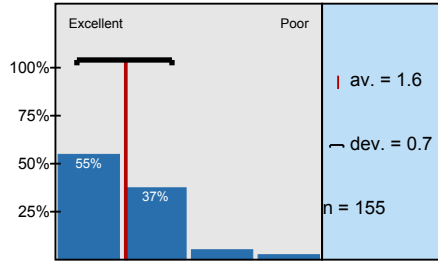


Histogram for scaled questions

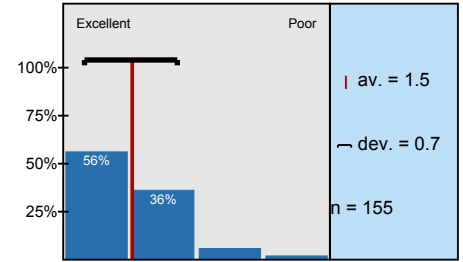

- I am having a very intense surgery that will require me to be off my feet some time. I took classes online so I didn't have to worry about getting to and from classes. As well as times of classes conflicting with appointments.

I have had many professors who refuse to answer emails, fail to updated the class material and I have even had a class where I wasn't able to view any of my grades for the entirety of the class with no help or reply from a professor. I love online classes, but I also want to know that if I have questions, I can speak to a professor about them.

- Have already completed a bachelor's degree.
 - I am continuing my education towards my bachelor's degree.
 - I am currently working to attain my bachelor's degree from U. of Phx. online.
 - I do not know if I will continue with school after this semester
 - I do not know if I will need to take any online classes with my work schedule.
 - I do not need any more lower division classes at this time.
 - I don't have any scheduled for next semester; after that I am transferring.
 - I don't know if I will need to.
 - I don't really retain much from my online classes. I'm just rushing the whole week trying to finish the problems in my homework. I feel if I took this class in school I would have actually learned a lot. But, since I work full time... I just don't have the time and I am stuck taking these online courses to [one day] get a degree so I don't have to stay at my horrible job for the rest of my life.
 - I found the online classes to be a bit more difficult. Maneuvering through the required assignments, submitting them, etc were difficult. Also, I think I learn more in a classroom setting.
 - I greatly prefer traditional classes to the online scenario because I am new to college and way out of my element. I learn better through lecture rather than the self-teaching practiced in an online environment and think I will do much better next semester.
 - I have a hard time remembering to do my assignments by the specific time they are due.
 - I may be transferring soon
 - I said unsure because I dont know, now if I dont know, how am I supposed to post a reason
 - I take other classes at other community colleges or Saddleback, depending on the offerings and availability.
 - I think I have taken everything I need to to obtain my Program Director's permit.
 - I was able to fit all traditional classes into my schedule for next semester, and will be transferring the following fall.
 - I will have completed the 12 units required by the state licencing department to be alone with children. That is my current goal.
 - I will take classes their if they are not available at my current school.
 - If necessary I get my credits. It depends if I can fit all classes into my schedule. I play baseball and the schedule is hectic.
 - It depends on the classes I'm looking for and their availability.
 - It depends on the electives I choose to take and when they are avialable
 - It is my last semester before I transfer to a university.
 - It was such a bad experience for me taking this Final Draft Pro online course from this instructor. Because I was new to online instruction and blackboard, it took a little time for me to understand how to work the applications. When I emailed the instructor for her guidance, I was given faulty information which frustrated me and caused unnecessary stress. So, I asked for help from another professor and learned that the instructions given to me on how to use blackboard were faulty. My online instructor, on the other hand, was threatened by me trying to resolve the problem through another professor and harassed me throughout the course instruction, by criticizing me in every exchange. She repeatedly accused me of slowing down her grading process because I sent my assignments to her twice via email and the backboard drop box. However, I only did that so she would not deduct points from my assignments - by claiming them as late or in non-receipt. And in fact, she actually did try and do that. So, when I queried her and suggested that we take a meeting with her Dean to resolve it, she quickly amended my grade because she knew I had kept copies of my sent receipts and therefore would have little ground to stand upon. At the end of the semester, I thanked her for the class and wished her a Happy Holidays and she responded by sending a very rude email informing me of all the problems I had caused her. Whereas I do not know her track record with others, I have never been so harassed by an instructor in my entire life. I'm 57. I also must comment that her instruction did not do the course description justice. I would have learned more by doing a tutorial online through a 90 day free trial period without the harassment. I only share this with you because I felt you needed to know. I do feel vulnerable that this instructor may harass me again in the future if this information I've shared is brought to her attention. Therefore, I want it to remain private. I repeat please not share this information with that instructor. The wrath of her anger frightens me. However, if you want copies of our exchanges, I am happy to download them so you can form your own judgments.
 - No more class are available for my degree. I have completed all my lower GE for CSUF and the classes I am taking now are the last ones that I need.
 - Taking a break Spring 09 due to family obligations. I have taken online classes for the past couple of years.
 - The only other calss that i need and is available would be to hard to complete i would need the classroom setting.

The instructions need to be very clear. Overall I would recommend the classes online.
 - The online class has been very good. The teacher Jennifer Jazayeri provides really good notes and teaches very well, even though over the internet.

- 2 instructors are excellent - psychology (Professor Gee excellent) and business (Professor McCarthy and Professor Cox - excellent). Both of those classes the professors were responsive and readily accessible. History was poor - he did not update syllabus, gave us wrong textbook information and seemed extremely disorganized (possibly something going on in his personal life or he was too busy to care)
- Announcements are only posted on message boards. I would also like messages emailed to me. Discussion board forums are not in real time and you have to read through a lot of string messages. I'm not really sure how to improve discussion board forums. I really don't have experience with course material updates.
- As mentioned before, I have had a lot of trouble, especially this semester, with professors who are too busy to even reply to emails, update material or post a section on blackboard for assignments to be turned in. Unfortunately, I had to take an unwanted "W" on my transcripts because I was so worried that the professor would completely flake out and forget about the class that I was going to fail due to the fact that I wasn't able to turn anything in on time. Other professors are great though, they respond fast and are there to help.
- During much of the week I am somewhere where I cannot access Blackboard, but can check email through a cell phone. Email updates would allow me to be notified of class announcements even if I'm unable to access Blackboard.

-
- Grades could be posted sooner. The teachers don't normally participate in discussion boards except for criticizing your post.
 - Grading is very slow- still have assignments that haven't been graded and this is our finals week. I would also like a teacher to respond more quickly to questions or concerns, instead of 2 weeks later. Also their syllabus and due dates were never changed to reflect the current semester and it was very difficult to follow and know when things were due. Every section on blackboard had different due dates.
 - I am unsure of the norm but this semester the teachers seemed to take longer to grade than past instructors have. It took almost 2 weeks for one assignment in the class I am taking now. The one that I took the first part of the semester, there were a few times that I waited almost 3 weeks.
 - I dislike the fact that work is only graded every few weeks. I do not know how I am progressing.
 - I don't know if my instructor didn't receive my e-mail or if she has a different address for me, but I sent an e-mail and never got a response.
 - I feel as some of the instructors just post assignments and leave. Adding more detail to assignment instructions would help clear things up, and having some way to contact my teacher; ex: a email they respond to. I would like if they got more involved in the discussion board because it is there class and it is comforting and less stressful knowing the teacher is there to help you out.
 - I wish the teachers did not take 1-2days to respond to emails but I do realize that they get emails from all of their students and that can pile up.
 - IDK He was prob really busy
 - It depended on the teacher. One teacher was very prompt and the other was very unorganized.
 - Make sure grades for exams and assignments are updated regularly.
 - My professors now grade quickly but in the past that hasn't been the case. Also, I wish professors for in-person classes at SB or IVC would post the grades on BB. Another thing, with online classes essays and midterms never receive any feedback. It's just a grade with no explanation why.
 - None of my teachers participated in the discussion boards, some of them seemed to take a very long time to grade things, some never made any announcements.
 - Poor discussion board participation- I said this because they instructor has never participated in our discussion boards. Fair- timely grading- often takes the professor longer to grade our assignments than was given to us to complete them.
 - Possibly quicker responses
 - Post grades sooner.
 - Professor Nguyen for Ps 1 was awful at responding.
 - So far everything has exceeded my expectations.
 - Some instructors are phenomenal with keeping students updated, grading assignments and clearly stating what is expected. Others make their grading very subjective and are weeks behind the class on grading the assignments and participation. It is very difficult to regulate this, just as it is with in-class courses.
 - Some of the announcements that the instructors make aren't very clear.
 - Sometimes we receive no feedback on discussion boards and the expectations for how much instructors expect us to write is not always clear. I often do not receive email responses or graded assignments in a timely manner.
 - Taking a course from another instructor who is not volatile.
 - Teachers need to update grades quicker. They don't realize how much that helps students maintain the grade they want throughout the semester. Class participation is an issue I've had with before. In my econ class, my teacher docked me big time because I posted multiple discussions in one day. To me, that's stupid.
 - The instructor requires you to submit your paper via Turnitin and then you are also required to print it out and mail it with it post marked by a certain date. This in my opinion defeats the purpose of online classes. I am currently attending the University of Phoenix and I submit all of my papers and projects electronically. This is one area that needs improvement in my opinion.
 - These areas vary depending on the instructor, some are very timely at responding to emails and some interact with the students on the discussion board, but others take a while to respond to emails and don't interact on the discussion boards. I believe that the only way to improve these areas would be to enforce standardized response times.
 - They could try updating our grades sooner. Not until the end of the semester.
 - announcements could be given a little more often, if even just an encouraging word or two.
 - gradebooks not available or locked is a nightmare. some instructors do not always respond to email ever

- After U. of Phx. and their online classes, it was a challenge to get acquainted with Blackboard, but I managed.
- All my work and grades just disappeared on day - all of it had to be recreated form scratch.
- At home I have a mac and sometimes programs are not supported by/with Safari. In those cases I use my work PC.
- Explorer not always compatible with Blackboard so I switch back and forth between Explorer and Mozilla Fox
- Frequently it does not let me submit assignments.
- I had a couple minor problems accessing web links. The problems were resolved quickly with the use of Blackboard help.
- I had a laptop turn off during an online midterm.
- I had difficulty logging into a specific class, and did not hear back from the teacher for over a week after repeated attempts to contact him. The problem was eventually resolved.
- I had issues with the uploading of homework assignments more than once.
- I have been unable to locate tabs where assignments were supposed to be turned in, and I therefore did not receive credit for them.
- I received incorrect information on how to use blackboard to sign in weekly and also where to find my weekly grades posted. This instructor is just not proficient on blackboard yet. However, never once did she suggest that I could resolve any of my concerns by going to the self-help tutorial or re-think her own instructions to see where the disconnect could have been. Instead, she blasted me.
- I wasn't able to view my grades for a class due to the fact that a professor never gave us the proper link to do so. Unfortunately, the professor also decided not to answer any of my emails over a span of 4 weeks, so I had to drop the class.
- Incompatability with specific browsers. Assessments crash resulting in missing due dates. Frequent unable to login.
- Just user error, not anything associated with the website itself
- My computer encountered problems with 'locked' assignments.
- My computer freezing while taking a test.
- Only once when I tried to upload a file with the "#" included in the file name. I emailed my teacher, Brenda Bruno, and she immediately responded instructing me to make sure of the same or to contact the 24 hour technical hotline.
- Some Blackboard issues. Getting booted out of quizzes, freezing up during exam.
- Sometimes the written lectures are a little hard to understand and on the discussion board it tends to delete the stuff that has been posted.
- The instructor was using an outdated Word processor that was unable to read assignments I completed using an updated program. Eventually I found a way to downgrade them, but it was a frustrating problem I wouldn't have had in a traditional class.
- The only class I repeated experienced difficulty with, and dropped the class twice were the computer instruction classes. I believe those courses would benefit greatly with a combo online/regular class schedule.
- The site was down.
- Time difference.
- When I have to take an Exam and I have about 3 hours to take it, when it time to submit my exam when Im finished the submit button was not there any longer causing me to retake the exam over or copy and paste it then turn it in that way to my instructor. It has been very frustrating lately when I try to take a test.
- When I was taking my midterm I had some technical problems with the website...and it was really hard to take the exam.
- When turning in one of my midterms, there was a timer set for an hour. I finished the midterm before the timer was up and the timer didn't stop at an hour. It went passed an hour and didn't turn in my test that I completed.
- completing the exams

- explorer not compatible with a few exams
- kicked me off the site while taking my timed midterm... when i got back on it did not save my answers but had the remaining time of 5 minutes left on the test.
- kicked me off the site.
- kicked off the site during my midterm.
- laptop crash, upload issues
- many things are difficult to find, or not available
- scoring well on tests sometimes, but other than that everything else is simple and self-explanatory
- the computer said I had already turned in a project when I hadn't and it wouldn't let me submit it. Through emailing the instructor it worked out, but it was a frustrating night.
- trouble with login

For those services that require improvement, how could they be enhanced?

- Blackboard crashes frequently and is generally unstable.
- Counseling needs some nicer staff members working up front.
- DSPS- requires a more timely manner. Financial Aid- needs to copy what IVC & OCC does such as credit cards issued in lieu of checks. Needs more staff to support financial aid in a more timely manner as many student depend on financial aid to pay bills! Blackboard should be upgraded to Blackboard Vista like OCC has.
- I found Financial Aid to be very poor. You either need more help or you need new people that truly care and don't judge. I found that they treated people as a number there with very little caring. Admissions - was okay - but not impressed.
- I have been to two counselors now trying to get a plan set up to transfer to a 4 year. However, they have both told me "it looks like your ready to transfer" and that I'm all set to go. I get very excited and when this last deadline to enroll passed by I didn't have the necessary paperwork ready, the essay to submit to colleges. I went to them for guidance on what I needed to do. I felt as if I was missing a lot- and it turns out I was! I'm be returning again to the counseling department to spell it out for them that I need someone to walk me through the process. The library needs more updated books. It is pretty sad to walk through the rows of sparsely filled books- it is like a ghost town in the library. Concerning the financial aid, I've had similar experiences with the financial aid department. I need someone that knows what they are talking about to talk to me about it. Is it really this hard?? Crazy....
- I know there are many councilers but they never seem to be available.
- I think all teachers should be required to used blackboard.
- Improve staff.
- It is hard to get a hold of someone to help you in counseling.
- It was rather difficult for me to find just exactly where I needed to go in order to just register. I did not see anything on the web page indicating to go to "My..." in order to register.
- It's a pain to go on campus to ask for apts.(counseling) I shouldn't have to wait on Monday to make one. I called to make an apt and I was on the phone for over 45 mins. I just hung up after that. Front desk lady is a little rude. The disable student person takes forever to respond to e-mails or forgets to e-mail professors about my special needs.
- More information regarding loans.
- Really need the help to further my education, as money is tight- but I don't qualify according to your system.
- SBC needs more advisors!!!
- The Financial Aid people tend to be kind of rude.
- The application process on line is tedious and frankly I believe you are making it very difficult for seniors to enroll. I'm not a senior, but getting there, and I have experience with computers and I found it difficult to enroll.
- The financial aid system for disbursing money needs to be updated. Mailing checks or having to pick them up is extremely outdated and a hassle. Also, all information for what needs to be turned in needs to be given at the first meeting. There have been too many times when I needed to turn something else in but wasn't told until I called and asked what was taking so long.
- When you call Blackboard you wait for a long time and then they usually refer you to someone else!

- better knowledge of major's in order to decide what school would be the best
- maybe being able to schedule online appointments. instead of calling, takes a long time to get a hold of someone
- the staff behind the counter give the impression that their time is being taken up. They are quiet and don't share information very readily. Getting information (even simple info) out of them is difficult. I know they get tired of giving the same info over and over but to those of us that come in we may have only heard that information for the first time .
- what I have found now that I am at my first semester at CSUF is that counselors should encourage students to go and talk to counselors at the school that they are planning on attending and see what they can do to utilize their time at a saddleback. I completed my math requirement for my certificate to go to a CSU and I was told by a counselor to not take any more math and focus on the other areas. I did have free time to take other classes a few semesters after that and didn't on the information that I received. Come to find out that I need higher levels of math to enter into the upper division courses to complete my bachelors degree that I could have taken at Saddleback. I blame myself because I knew that the counselors are extremely busy and generalize for every student but they could encourage students to go the college they plan on attending and figure out the route they need to take, plan from the GOAL backwards!

What, if anything, could be done to improve your online educational experiences at Saddleback College?

- I think that professors teaching online classes shouldn't be allowed to teach more than 3 online classes at the same time, even at different schools, and also have another job.
