BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (CSUF, CSULB, CPSUSLO, CSUSM, CHAPMAN UNIVERSITY, SDSU, UCB, UCI, UCR, USC)

A Business Administration degree is designed to prepare students for entry into successful careers in business. Admission to many business programs is competitive. Students are strongly advised to complete all of the major preparation courses before transfer. Completion of major preparation and the highest possible GPA makes a student competitive.

Areas of concentration for the Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration include: Accounting; Business Economics; Entertainment & Tourism; Entrepreneurship; Finance; Management; Information Systems; Management Science; and Marketing.

CSUF ADVISORY: (1) All courses for the major must be completed with a grade of "C" or better; (2) The "credit/no credit" option may not be used for courses in the major.

Lower-Division Core Requirements: ACCT 1A, 1B; BUS 104; ECON 4, 2; BUS 14; CIM1; MATH (11 or 3A)

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

Lower-Division Core Requirements: ACCT 1A, 1B; BUS 104; ECON 4, 2; BUS 14; CIM 1; MATH (11 or 3A)

Foreign Language Requirement: Intermediate competency in one foreign language (Level 3) in Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Portuguese, or Spanish is prerequisite to the required upper-division concentration courses.

CSUF ADVISORY: (1) All courses for the major must be completed with a grade of "C" or better; (2) The "credit/no credit" option may not be used for courses in the major.

CSU LONG BEACH

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

NOTE: *All options in the Business Administration major are impacted.* Students are advised to refer to the CSU Long Beach catalog and the CSULB admissions website for impaction admission screening criteria and GPA requirements at www.csulb.edu/depts/enrollment/admissions/impacted_major.html.

Options in the upper-division level in Business Administration include: Accountancy; Finance; Human Resources Management; International Business; Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; Operations Management.

Required Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; BUS 12; MATH 10 OR 9 (MATH 10 Preferred); MATH 11; *PHIL (12 or 15) (**Accountancy majors must take PHIL 15, and Management Information Systems majors must take PHIL 12*); CIM 1;

ADD for the International Business Option: *Foreign language preparation required is two (2) years (four semesters) at the baccalaureate level of one of the following languages:* Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Portuguese, Russian, or Spanish. The choice of language will determine the country or geographic area about which the student must study at the upper-division level after transfer.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

NOTE: *All courses for taken for the major must be completed with a grade of "C" (2.0) or better. Courses cannot be taken for credit/no credit grading. For business status consideration, the lower-division pre-business core must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.5.*

Required Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, 1B; BUS 12, 104; ECON 2, 4; MATH 11; (PSYC 1 or SOC 1)

NOTE: CIM 1 is recommended to meet CSUSM's College of Business Administration computer competency requirement.

Required Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, 1B; BUS 14), 104, (BUS 102 or SP 1); ECON 2, 4; MATH (8 and 11 or 2), 10, MATH 11 or 3A; PHIL 15

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS

NOTE: *All courses in the major are to be taken for a letter grade. A minimum grade of "C-" is required for all lower-division core courses.*

Required Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; MATH (8 and 11, or 2), 10, MATH 11 or 3A; PHIL 15

General Education and Common Requirements: Full CSU or IGETC certification completed prior to matriculation satisfies the following GE requirements:

- All Shared Inquiry (Artistic, Quantitative, Natural Science, Social, Values/Ethical, Written).
- Global Study and Citizenship/Community Service of the Global Citizen Cluster.

Remaining GE requirements are eligible to be met by coursework included within certification or completed additionally include:

- Foreign Language (200 level or higher)
- Inter/Multidisciplinary Study (lower division credit only, must be directly equivalent to CU course)

****NOTE:*** BUS 104 is not required for Accounting or International Business majors.

*****NOTE:*** MATH (3A or 11) is not required for International Business majors.

International Business major is designated as an impacted program and specific regulations related to admissions are imposed. Students are advised to complete lower-division equivalencies for the foreign language and regional/cultural studies emphases portions of this major at Saddleback College.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

****Minimum Eligibility Requirements for Admission:***

Students applying to UC Berkeley's business major in Fall 2009 and beyond must complete the College of Letters and Science seven (7) course breadth requirement detailed below. Students applying in Fall 2008 must take the nine (9) course breadth requirement. See ASSIST for the nine (9) course breadth requirement.

1. Complete all prerequisite courses for letter grades.
2. Complete the seven (7) course breadth requirement by the end of the Spring term prior to Fall transfer. Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate credit will not count for breadth. See ASSIST for acceptable courses. **General Education Breadth Requirements: IGETC does NOT satisfy G.E. breadth requirements for this major.**
3. Complete the foreign language requirement.
4. Complete at least 60 UC-transferable semester units.
5. Achieve at least a 3.9 GPA (or higher to be competitive) in the prerequisite courses and overall coursework.

NOTE: All of the required courses must be completed by the end of the spring term prior to starting at UC Berkeley's Haas School of Business. Prerequisite courses must be completed no more than 5 years before admission to the Haas School of Business. **Admissions applications are for fall semesters only and must be filed during the initial UC application filing period.** Admitted transfer students will be required to begin coursework in July -- for details, refer to: http://www.haas.berkeley.edu/Undergrad/major_expansion.html

Lower-Division Prerequisites: **Business:** BUS 1; **Economics:** ECON 2, 4; **English:** ENG 1A, 1B, 25; **Math:** MATH 3A; **Statistics:** MATH 10

Repeating Prerequisites: *If a student has repeated or taken more than one course to fulfill a prerequisite, the student must use the first attempt to satisfy the requirement if a grade of C- or higher was received. If a student receives a D+ or lower in a prerequisite the course must be repeated. If the student received a C- or higher for the first attempt the prerequisite should not be repeated.*

Foreign Language: *For many students who attended high school outside of the United States, English is their foreign language. For example, if a student went to high school in China where the language of instruction was Mandarin and took the 3rd level of English, then English is considered the foreign language.*

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, ACCT 1B, MATH (3A **and** 3B), MATH 10, ECON (4 **and** 2)

NOTE: Per UCI, this major will be accepting applications for Fall 2010. Junior-level application with the highest grades overall (minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0) and who satisfactorily complete required lower-division major requirements will be given preference for admission.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, ACCT 1B, MATH (3A **and** 3B), MATH 10, ECON (4 **and** 2)

NOTE: Per UCI, this major will be accepting application for Fall 2009. Junior-level applicants with the highest grades overall (minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0) who satisfactorily complete the following requirements will be given preference for admission: 1) Completion of one year of college mathematics. A semester of pre-calculus and a semester of calculus are not sufficient to satisfy this requirement. 2) Completion of one year of computer science courses. The course work must contain at least one UC-transferable programming course involving the concepts of object-oriented programming in such languages as C++, Java, Smalltalk, or Eiffel, or functional programming such as languages as Scheme, Lisp, or ML. Programming-only courses in Basic, Fortran, Cobal, Pascal or C are not acceptable. 3) Completion of courses equivalent to Economic 20A-B and Management 30A, 30B.

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, ACCT 1B, MATH (3A **and** 3B), MATH 10, , MATH 26, ECON (4 **and** 2)

UC RIVERSIDE

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A, 1B; BUS 1; (CIM 1 **or** CS 1A); (ECON 2 **and** 4); MATH (8 **and** 11, **or** 3A), 10

NOTE: Per UCR, transfer students ***must*** complete all IGETC requirements.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Applications for admission to USC's Marshall School of Business can be submitted after completing at least three semesters of college work and 30 transferable units as well as the courses listed below. Admission is competitive; students with an overall GPA of 3.6 and grades of "B" or better in the courses required for admission will have an advantage in the admissions review process. Students who wish to transfer to USC as a Business major must complete the required courses listed below.

***Required Lower-Division Courses:** ECON 2, 4; ENG 1A, 1B; MATH (3A** or 11**)

*In addition, students who successfully complete Saddleback's ACCT (1A and 1B) with a grade of "B" or better will be allowed to enroll in USC's BUAD 305x rather than BUAD 250AB after transfer. Contact USC's Marshall School of Business – Office of Undergraduate Admissions at (213) 740-8885 or their website at www.marshall.usc.edu for more information.

Please refer to the current USC catalog for further details pertaining to program requirements, and the "Transferring to USC" booklet for general education and prerequisite information (available in the Counseling Services office), or online at www.usc.edu/transferring.

NOTES:

- As each college/university has its own orientation to their Business Administration major, read the entire Business Administration major section in the catalog of each college/university to which you are considering transferring. Pay particular attention to the upper-division requirements.
- Research the different options in Business Administration you may want to specialize in, and make sure the college/university you are transferring to offers it.
- Contact each college/university that you are interested in. Ask them to send you information about their Business Administration program; selection criteria, GPA requirements, and other pertinent admissions information. Also ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
- Visit each school to which you are considering transferring.
- Research careers related to your chosen major.
