ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

COMMUNICATIVE DISORDERS/SPEECH PATHOLOGY (CSUFr, CSULB, CSULA, SFSU)

A variety of university majors have as part of their name "communication." There may be great differences between these various majors in terms of academic emphasis, required courses, transfer requirements, and the occupational preparation provided. Students should pay particular attention to the descriptive information provided by the specific campus to which they are considering transferring.

This advisement sheet addresses majors, which usually emphasize the identification, diagnosis and treatment of disorders of speech, voice, language, and hearing. This major provides good preparation for graduate clinical study in speech-language pathology, as well as providing a broad liberal arts education. Most universities offering a bachelor's degree in Communicative Disorders, also offer graduate-level study leading to master's degrees and specialized certificates and credential programs. Students are advised to read the Communicative Disorders section in the catalog of each school in which they are interested. Students are encouraged to also read advisement sheets for Communication Studies.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

Articulation agreements can change without notice at any point during your time at Saddleback College. Please refer to the college catalogs and websites of the transfer schools you are considering, as well as the state-wide articulation database for CSU and UC campuses, www.assist.org, for the most current information. Students are urged to contact a Saddleback College counselor to review this information on a regular basis.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN COMMUNICATIVE DISORDERS

Note: Transfer students may only enter at the upper division (junior) level. You are considered an upper-division transfer student if you will have completed 60 or more transferable semester units or 90 transferable quarter units by the end of the prior Summer term for Fall entrance or the prior Fall term for Spring entrance. As an upper-division transfer student, you must also meet minimum CSU admission requirements to be considered for admission. Be aware that some requirements in Written Communication, Oral Communication, Critical Thinking and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning must be completed with a grade of 'C' or better **by the end of the prior Spring term for Fall admission or by the end of the prior Summer term for Spring admission.** The Bachelor of Arts in Communicative Disorders program is impacted. Note: The Bachelor of Arts degree in Communicative Disorders prepares students who desire to obtain a graduate degree in Communicative Disorders with an option in either audiology or speech-language pathology. A total of 180 units is required for the Bachelor of Arts degree in Communicative Disorders, including a minimum of 92 units for the major.

Lower-Division Requirements: ENG 1B; MATH 8 **and** Math 10. (**A minimum "C" grade is required for all lower-division courses.**) Electives: SL 1, CD 123.
