### ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

#### **ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE (CRIMINAL JUSTICE) (CSUF, CSULB, SDSU)**

Administration of Justice or Criminal Justice is the study of the causes, consequences, and control of crime. Like other new and developing fields, Criminal Justice is difficult to define. The major draws from a number of different disciplines, including psychology, public administration, philosophy, sociology, and law.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

#### **CSU FULLERTON**

##### **BACHELOR OF ARTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE**

*There are **no** lower-division courses required in the major.* CSU Fullerton's Criminal Justice curriculum can accommodate any/all transferable lower-division coursework of a related nature (e.g., administration of justice, police science, etc.), as CSUF's Criminal Justice offerings are exclusively upper-division. #### **CSU LONG BEACH**

##### **BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE**

***Lower-Division Requirements:*** HS (37 or 119); PSYC 1; PS 1; PHIL 12; SOC 1

***Students intending to transfer from a community college to CSU Long Beach for the B.S. in Criminal Justice program are advised to complete general education requirements prior to transfer. Other criminal justice courses taken at community colleges will be accepted as lower division electives provided the college where they were taken designated them as transferable to CSU. ##### BACHELOR OF SCIENCE - CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION

*Preparation for the Major:* MATH 10; PS 1; SOC 1, 2

- As each college/university has its own orientation to their Administration of Justice (Criminal Justice) major, read the entire Administration of Justice (Criminal Justice) major section in the catalog of each college/university to which you are considering transferring. Pay particular attention to the upper-division requirements.
- Contact each college/university that you are interested in. Ask them to send you information about their Administration of Justice (Criminal Justice) program; selection criteria, GPA requirements, and other pertinent admissions information. Also, ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
- Visit each school to which you are considering transferring.
- Research careers related to your chosen major.
