ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

ECONOMICS (CSUF, CSULB, CSUSB, CSUSM, SDSU, UCI, UCLA, UCR, UCSD)

Economic methods are used to study a basic question that faces all societies: How should limited resources be used to produce goods and how should that production be distributed? Not all wants can be satisfied because resources and knowledge are limited. Therefore, societies are faced with choices. These choices are made in different ways: by custom, by command and centralized control, or by a system of markets and prices as in our mixed economy.

Economists examine alternative solutions to the basic economic problem by analyzing costs and benefits of changing existing patterns of resource use. Economists work in many specialties including money and banking, international trade and finance, labor, public finance, industry policy, environment and natural resources, business cycles, and forecasting.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

Articulation agreements can change without notice at any point during your time at Saddleback College. BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; MATH (11 or 3A), CIM (1 or 10); MATH 10

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 4 is required. (Examples: FR 4; GER 4; SPAN 4; SL 4 at Saddleback College.)

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS – EMPHASIS IN INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; MATH (11 or 3A), MATH 10; CIM (1 or CIM 10)

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 4 or higher is required, (Examples: FR 4; GER 4; SPAN 4 at Saddleback College.) Students who have graduated from high school in another country where the language of instruction is not English have met the language requirement for this major.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS – EMPHASIS IN PRE-PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; MATH (11 or 3A), CIM (1 or 10) MATH 10; SP 3

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 3 is required, (Examples: FR 3; GER 3; SPAN 3; SL 3 at Saddleback College.)

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS – SPECIALIZATION IN QUANTITATIVE ANALYSIS

Lower-Division Preparation: ACCT 1A; ECON 2, 4; MATH 3A; CIM (1 or 10); MATH 10

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 3 is required, (Examples: FR 3; GER 3; SPAN 3; SL 3 at Saddleback College.)

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ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

UC IRVINE

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS

Transfer applicants with the highest grades overall and who have satisfactorily completed course prerequisites will be given preference for admission. All applicants must complete one course in microeconomics, one course in macroeconomics, and one semester or two quarters of approved calculus. Prospective students are advised to complete a second semester of calculus, in addition to the courses required for transfer student admission. An honors program in Economics is available; contact the School of Social Sciences at (949) 824-6803.

Lower-Division Preparation: ECON 4, 2; MATH (3A and 3B), MATH (3C and 26); CS (1A and 4A and 4B); CIM 2A and 10) or (CS 4A and 4B); ECON 2, 4; MATH (3A and 3B), MATH (3C and 26); **AND select two (2) introductory social science courses in disciplines other than Economics:** ANTH 1, 2, 3, 9; GEOG 1, 2, 3; PS 4; PSYC 1; SOC 1

UC LOS ANGELES

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS

This major is highly selective. All preparatory courses should be completed by the spring term just prior to transfer. All courses must be taken for a letter grade. The calculus course requirements should be met as early as possible. **After transfer to UCLA, students may not change their major to Economics if they were originally admitted to a major outside the Department of Economics. Lower-Division Preparation: ECON 4, 2; MATH 3A, 3B; ENG 1B

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS – INTERNATIONAL AREA STUDIES

This major is highly selective. All preparatory courses (except foreign language courses) should be completed by the spring term just prior to transfer. All courses must be taken for a letter grade. The calculus course requirements should be met as early as possible. **After transfer to UCLA, students may not change their major to Economics/International Area Studies if they were originally admitted to a major outside the Department of Economics. Lower-Division Preparation: ECON 4, 2; MATH 3A, 3B; **AND 4th semester of any modern foreign language which is spoken in the geographical area of your major concentration.****

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ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

UC SAN DIEGO

NOTE: *Transfer students are strongly advised to complete as many preparatory courses as soon as possible for their major before enrolling at UC San Diego. Preparing well for the major helps students move efficiently toward graduation.*

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS

This major is designed to provide a broad understanding of resource-allocation and income-determination mechanisms. Both the development of the tools of economics analysis and their applications to contemporary problems and public policy are stressed.

Lower-Division Requirements: ECON 2, 4; (MATH 3A or 11, MATH 3B, 3C) or (MATH 3A, 3B, 3C)

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS – MANAGEMENT SCIENCE

The Management Science major builds on a set of related quantitative methods for optimal allocation of scarce resources. The major introduces students to the structure of these techniques and their application in both private and public enterprise. While Management Science majors will gain some familiarity with the traditional functional fields of business management, this program is more tightly focused and more quantitative than a traditional business administration major.

Lower-Division Requirements: MATH 3A, 3B, 3C, 26; ECON 4, 2; ACCT 1A
