INTERIOR DESIGN (CSUC, CSULB, SDSU)

Courses in Interior Design encompass the study of design theory, aesthetics, history, graphics, lighting, space planning, interior construction, and professional practice. Students may secure positions in architectural firms, commercial and residential design firms, state and local government agencies, private corporations, furniture manufacturing companies, and design showrooms

BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS IN ART – OPTION IN INTERIOR DESIGN

The B.F.A. in Interior Design is offered as preparation for the student who will eventually seek the Master's degree, or a position as a professional designer. The B.F.A. program is a rigorous and competitive one. **Portfolio review is required for admission to the professional B.F.A. program.** Students must achieve a "C" or better in each required course to progress in the sequence of study. Refer to the CSU Long Beach catalog, ASSIST at www.assist.org, and the Design Department website at www.csulb.edu/depts/design/ for further details regarding program requirements for this impacted major.

Lower-Division Requirement: ART 25, 26, 40; ID (123 **and** 133), ARCH 124A; ID 121; 116; 127

NOTE: Students are advised to consult with a CSULB program advisor regarding selection of electives.

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ART – EMPHASIS IN INTERIOR DESIGN

Lower-Division Preparation: ART 80; 40; 81; 41; 25; 26

IMPORTANT: After transfer, a portfolio review is required to advance to upper-division interior design coursework. Students are advised to refer to the SDSU catalog and to contact SDSU's School of Art, Design, and Art History at (619) 594-6511 for details pertaining to the nature and content of SDSU's portfolio review.

NOTES:

- As each college/university has its own orientation to their Interior Design major, read the entire Interior Design major section in the catalog of each college/university to which you are considering transferring. Pay particular attention to the upper-division requirements.
- Contact each college/university that you are interested in. Ask them to send you information about their Interior Design programs; selection criteria, GPA requirements, and other pertinent admissions information. Also, ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
- Visit each school to which you are considering transferring.
- Research careers related to your chosen major.
