ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

SOCIOLOGY (CSUF, CSULB, CSUSM, SDSU, UCI, UCLA, UCSD, CHAPMAN UNIVERSITY)

Sociology is the systematic and scientific study of society and social behavior. It is a useful major providing a liberal arts background for students considering post-baccalaureate careers, in which an understanding of human behavior would be an asset. The Sociology major can also provide an excellent background for graduate education in sociology, social work, law, government, public policy, environmental studies, and education.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

Articulation agreements can change without notice at any point during your time at Saddleback College. NOTE: A total of nine (9) advisor-approved lower-division units may be transferred from a community college, and applied toward the 36 units required for the Sociology major. Coursework must be taken for a letter grade and completed with a grade of "C" or better.

Lower-Division Requirement: SOC 1; **AND the following courses can be transferred for credit toward the major within the nine (9) unit limitation:** SOC 15, 21, 25, (SOC 20 or HIST 20), (SOC 30 or PSYC 30)

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN SOCIOLOGY

Lower-Division Preparation: MATH 10; SOC 1, 2

Foreign Language Requirement: Proficiency equivalent to a Foreign Language level 3 is required, (Examples: FR 3; GER 3; SPAN 3; SL 3 at Saddleback College).

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN SOCIOLOGY

NOTE: *In fulfillment of the requirements listed below, a single course may be used only once.*

Lower-Division Preparation: SOC (1 **and** 2); **AND select one (1) additional course from another social science discipline and an additional social science course:** ANTH 1, 2, 3, 9; ECON 2, 4; GEOG 1, 2, 3; PS 4; PSYC 1, 4;

Select one (1) course not already taken from: ANTH 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 21, 42; CCS 1, 2, 10; (ECON 6 **or** ENV 6), (ECON 11 **or** PS 11), 20; GEOG 38; PS 1, 10, (PS 11 **or** ECON 11), 12, 14, (PS 80 **or** HIST 80); PSYC 2, 3, 4, 7, 16, 21, (PSYC 30 **or** SOC 30), 37; SOC 2, 6, 10, 15, (SOC 20 **or** HIST 20), 21, 25, (SOC 30 **or** PSYC 30)

Select two (2) courses not previously taken from: (PSYC 30 **or** SOC 30); SOC 10, (SOC 20 **or** HIST 20); CS 1A, (CS 4A **and** 4B); *MATH (3A **and** 10)

***NOTE:** The MATH 3A and MATH 10 combination is unique to this UCI major and should be taken by students who are certain they will transfer to UC Irvine.

Sociology Core: SOC 1, 24

Select twelve (12) units from: ANTH 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 42; SOC 4, 5, 6, 10, 20, 21, 30

Recommended GE: MATH 10, ANTH 2, SOC 2

General Education and Common Requirements: Chapman University accepts either CSU G.E. Certification or IGETC Certification. Students are advised to consult with a Saddleback College counselor regarding additional coursework that can be completed prior to transfer to fulfill additional Chapman University's Common Requirements in quantitative reasoning, foreign language, world cultures, and human diversity.

Also, ask for information about their campus, services, housing, etc. Meet with college/university representatives when they visit Saddleback College.
