ADVISEMENT INFORMATION FOR TRANSFER MAJORS

SPEECH COMMUNICATION (CPSUSLO, CSUF, CSULB)

A variety of university majors have as part of their name "communication." There may be great differences between these various majors in terms of academic emphasis, required courses, transfer requirements, and the occupational preparation provided. Students should pay particular attention to the descriptive information provided by the specific campus to which they are considering transferring.

This advisement sheet addresses "Speech Communication" majors, which usually emphasize public speaking, debate, and interpersonal communication. This type of major provides a broad liberal arts education, and is good preparation for communications-related occupations in mass media, business, government, and education. Students are encouraged to read the other advisement sheets for Communication Studies, and Communicative Disorders/Speech Pathology.

Listed below are Saddleback College (SC) courses that have been articulated with selected example universities, and represents lower-division preparation for the major. In addition, students are advised to complete General Education requirements prior to transfer.

Articulation agreements can change without notice at any point during your time at Saddleback College. Please refer to the college catalogs and websites of the transfer schools you are considering, as well as the state-wide articulation database for CSU and UC campuses, www.assist.org, for the most current information. Students are urged to contact a Saddleback College counselor to review this information on a regular basis.

NOTE: Students are advised to consult with a CSUF Speech Communication program advisor regarding selection of 15 units of lower-division electives (Examples: SP 2, 3, 5, 35). **Additional lower-division coursework to be taken at CSU Fullerton after transfer.**

CSULB offers three (3) options in Communication Studies: Communication Studies, Interpersonal and Organizational Communication and Communication, Culture and Public Affairs.

Lower-Division Requirements: SP 3, 5, (SP 1 or SP 35 or TA 35)
