

BY-LAWS
OF CAMPUS DEMOCRACY

I. MEMBERSHIP

A. To remain in good standing with the group, members must attend at-least three meetings a month. Members should remain knowledgeable and up to date on issues and current events.

II. DUES

A. Dues will be organized and received as necessity presents itself. (Dues are not a requirement for group membership. Amounts needed will be shaped around willingness to pay.)

III. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

A. President is to attend all meetings. Duties include appointing a Vice President, finalizing petitions to pursue a debate project and representing the body of the group.

B. Vice President is to attend all meetings. Duties include directing activities and enforcing a schedule. If President is unable to perform his/her duties, Vice President must complete duties of both. (If V.P. is continually in a dual position, he/she may impeach President if group, by 2/3rds vote, feels the President is not fulfilling his/her duties).

C. Secretary's duties are to direct and manage the organization of the information and paperwork involved with working with multiple clubs in planning a debate to ensure the club can keep up with it's goals. If the Secretary feels that club is not fulfilling it's potential, he/she must notify Vice President to push group in correct direction.

D. Treasurer's duties are to project potential costs for completing debate projects. He/She will handle and manage all currency that flows through the club. It is the treasurer's responsibility to keep the club informed of it's cost requirements to ensure that cost necessity can be met.

IV. CABINET

A. President holds highest decision-making power over any individual in group. However, a vote of 2/3rds or more can override presidential veto power (See article VI, section 1 of Constitution)-also see article VI, section 2.
