**End Notes**

Research papers are made up primarily of information taken from other sources. “In borrowing any material, you want to be careful to avoid charges of *plagiarism*. Any uncredited use of another’s information, ideas, or words is plagiarism. You must be certain to acknowledge in some way any use you make of material that is not your own or not common knowledge. You must be particularly careful about proper documentation when you are paraphrasing.”<sup>1</sup>

This paper will utilize end notes to avoid plagiarism. All end notes must list the title of the source, the author’s name, the publisher, city of publication, date of publication, and page number. End notes must be double spaced. Some sample end notes are shown below.

All citings must list the title of the source, the author’s name, the publisher, city of publication, and date of publication. Some sample citings are shown below. Citings must be double spaced.
