



SADDLEBACK COLLEGE FOUNDATION GRANT PROPOSAL 2008

The Saddleback College Foundation is pleased to announce the distribution of \$100,000 in funding through a grant application process during the 2008-2009 school year. It is the intent of the Foundation Board of Governors to extend this opportunity to programs or projects not covered through the annual college budget. Grant funding is available to faculty, staff and administrators of the college. Timeline for applications and awards are specified below.

Grant funds are generated through the annual foundation gala, "40th Anniversary Gala" and through other donations to the foundation.

or in the Foundation Office (AGB 119) beginning August 25, 2008. Completed applications must be submitted to the Foundation office by 4:00 P.M. on September 26, 2008. No late applications will be considered for funding.

AMOUNT OF GRANTS

A total of \$100,000 will be allocated to this program. Grant awards will be for a maximum of \$5,000.

GRANT CRITERIA

Grant requests will be evaluated based on responses to the questions on the application form. Proposals will be considered only if regular college funding is not available. ***Programs or projects that qualify for annual college budget funds will not be considered. Funds will not be awarded for travel or conference attendance.***

EVALUATION AND SELECTION

The review and selection committee will consist of a subcommittee of foundation board of governors' volunteers.

All grant applicants must agree to provide a follow-up report at the conclusion of the project or program within one year from the original allocation date. Funds must be expended within one year unless there are extenuating circumstances.
