Eligibility to Apply: Completion of Biology Pre-requisites-Anatomy, Microbiology and Physiology, with a GPA of 2.8 or above, and completion of English 1A with a “C” or better.

Petitions must be approved prior to applying and must be on file with Admission and Records. Courses in progress will not be used to determine points but may be used in the case of ties as one of several criteria in ranking.

5. Assessment and Readiness testing TEAS testing- First time ATI testing will be available through Saddleback College. Only the first passing score will be counted for points. No retesting allowed within one year of a previous test score unless an updated version of the test is taken or the test is repeated after a remediation plan.
