Important! The Matriculation Process will now consist of three separate parts including: 1) Online Orientation, 2) Assessments, and 3) Group Advisement.

Testing will be held in **SSC-225A**

Arrive 15 minutes early!

We cannot admit late arrivals.

Bring The Following To Your Testing Session:

- Picture I.D. (i.e. driver's license, high school I.D. card, Passport, etc.)
- Saddleback student I.D. number
- # 2 lead pencil

Students who do not speak English fluently may choose to take the English as a Second Language (ESL) test. **See ESL flyer.**

New or Returning students need to apply at the Admissions & Records Office before making the appointment. **Continuing students** may call the Matriculation Office to make an appointment. Have your Saddleback student ID number ready.

Steps for YOUR Matriculation Process

1. Submit an Application

Applications are available online or in the Office of Admission and Records at Saddleback College. File Early!

2. Complete the Required Matriculation Process (by appointment).

If you have a severe physical, communication, or visual limitation that might require testing accommodations, or if you have extreme difficulty with reading, writing, spelling, math or understanding/remembering information, please contact the Special Services Office in SSC 113 at (949)582-4885.

The assessment will include information regarding the reading and English language proficiency, math skills, goals, career aspirations, academic history and/or need for special services.

3. Attend an Advisement Session

You will schedule an advisement appointment after your assessment session. During the advisement session with a counselor, you will be provided with the following information:

- * Assessment results and placement recommendations
 - * Information related to how your Saddleback coursework can be used for AA/AS, certificate or transfer
 - * Student support services and special services
 - * College course selection procedures
 - * Your rights and responsibilities as a college student
 - * Assistance in completion of your "1st semester Student Education Plan"

4. Register for Classes!

When you have completed the above three steps, you may register online, by telephone or in-person during your assigned registration time given from the Admissions and Records Office .

Important Note!

Submitting alternative evidence to substitute for placement testing.

It is the responsibility of the student to provide specific evidence to the Matriculation Office, SSC 225, five (5) days before your assigned test date. You may not be required to complete portions of the assessment step of the matriculation process if you have met any of the following criteria: (providing proof does not exempt you from step 3. A student may be exempt from attending step 3 if they have successfully completed 30 semester units or 45 quarter units).

1. You have taken a placement/assessment at another California Community College with placements as well as raw scores
 2. You must take an AP English or Math (Calculus AB or BC) exams and received a score of 3 or higher.
 3. You have completed a course in English composition and Math with a "C or Cr" from an accredited college/university
