

## **Statement of Intent to Enroll (SIE) at Cal State Fullerton FAQs**

**Statement of Intent to Enroll (SIE)** is an active process by which a student accepts or declines their offer of admission by clicking on the Accept or Decline button within their Student Portal. The process will be piloted for Fall 2010 with Upper Division transfer students who will have until June 1, 2010 to comply. At this time, there is no payment that accompanies the SIE, but the deadline is firm. In future years, all admitted students who wish to attend Cal State Fullerton must complete their SIE, including the submission of a non-refundable \$250 enrollment deposit towards their registration fees.

The purpose of the SIE is to more accurately predict the entering class and to help ensure that students who do not attend to not take classroom seats away from students who do enroll.

### **Frequently Asked Questions and Answers for the Fall, 2010 process.**

**Q: Who is required to participate in the SIE process?**

*A: For the first year, Upper Division Transfer Students must participate in the SIE process. In future years, all admitted students will be required to participate. In future years the process will include the submission of a non-refundable \$250 enrollment deposit towards registration fees.*

**Q: How and where do students accept admission?**

*A: Admitted students must log into their Student Portal to use the SIE process.*

**Q: What happens if a transfer student misses the June 1, 2010 deadline?**

*A: Students who miss the required deadline for SIE submission will have their admission rescinded.*

**Q: What happens if a student is admitted after June 1, 2010?**

*A: Students who are admitted after June 1, 2010 will have two weeks from their admit date to submit their SIE.*

**Q: Are there any requirements beyond the SIE that a student must meet in order to indicate their intent to attend?**

*A: All students must comply with all of the terms as listed on their offer of admissions. These requirements include but are not limited to maintaining eligibility throughout their final year/semester of classes, submitting final transcripts by the deadline, and paying registration fees.*

**Q: Do other campuses require an SIE?**

*A: Many other Cal State campuses, all of the University of California campuses, and many private schools require students to participate in a SIE process.*

**Q: How will students be notified of the SIE requirement?**

*A: All admitted Upper Division Transfer students will be notified in their admission letter and through reminders on their individual student portals.*

**Q: Why are you piloting this process with Upper Division Transfer students?**

*A: In order to implement this process on a full-scale basis for the 2011-2012 admission cycle, it is critical to ensure the process is fully functional by piloting the process for the 2010-2011 academic year. Upper Division Transfer students were selected for participation because they are the largest subgroup within our campus population.*

### **Frequently Asked Questions and Answers for the Fall, 2011 process (\$250 enrollment deposit required).**

**Q: What if a student is on Financial Aid?**

*A: Students who have a minimal expected family contribution (EFC) (exact figure to be determined) will have the \$250 enrollment deposit waived.*

**Q: What happens if a student submits an SIE and does not attend Cal State Fullerton?**

*A: The enrollment deposit is non-refundable. Thus, students who submit their enrollment deposit and choose not to attend will forfeit their deposit. Refunds will only be issued for students who have their admission rescinded by Cal State Fullerton.*

**Q: What happens if a student submits an SIE to more than once campus to hold their spot and ultimately chooses another campus?**

*A: Students will forfeit their enrollment deposit if they choose to not attend Cal State Fullerton.*
