COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Provides a comprehensive overview of network security including authentication methods, common network attacks, safeguarding against attacks, remote access, email, the web, directory and file transfer, wireless data, various network devices and media, and proper use of perimeter topologies such as DMZs, Extranets, Intranets, cryptography basics, asymmetric and symmetric algorithms, and operational and organizational security. Geared for students pursuing CompTIA Security+ Certification (formerly CIM 284).

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. List security ramifications: costs of intrusion.
2. Describe biometrics.
3. Explain social engineering.
4. Examine virtual private networks.
5. Describe how to secure e-mail works.
6. Evaluate instant messaging.
7. Explain file transfer services.
8. Explain how to conduct a wireless site survey.
9. Analyze how intrusion detection systems operate.
10. Design perimeter security topologies.
11. Describe the purpose of honeypots.
12. Explain network hardening.
13. Apply concepts of using cryptography.
14. Describe the disaster recovery planning process.
15. Examine computer forensics.

1. Identify social engineering attacks, classify software attacks and identify hardware attacks
2. Define system components that are subject to attacks
3. Employ corporate security policy compliance, legal and physical security compliance and educate users with information
