Course Description

Introduction to Web design and creation of Web pages using modern tools such as Adobe Dreamweaver and WordPress. Provides an overview of HTML, CSS, Javascript, graphics and video integration on a Web site maintained by the student. Assignments include weekly hours in BGS 248 or other location.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Explain and implement W3C Web site validation.
 2. Construct a Web site using Dreamweaver, that contains HTML tags, CSS code, JavaScript, video, sound, graphics, Microsoft word integration, tables, forms, object tag, page layout, fonts, colors and frames.
 3. Analyze various Web site issues consisting of ftp, internet, security, accessibility and social implications.
 4. Compare various forms of animation and video adding software.
 5. Construct discussion board and WordPress threads

Students who complete this course will be able to explain and implement W3C website validation.

Website Construction: Students who complete this course will be able to construct a website using Adobe Dreamweaver, that constains links, HTML tags, CSS code, JavaScript, video, sound, graphics, Microsoft Word integration, tables forms and advanced HTML.
