## READING COMPETENCY - Complete Option A or Option B

Option B: Evidence of one of the following standardized examination scores:

1. A score of $30-37$ on the CTEP Reading Challenge
2. 400 or above on the Critical Reading section of the SAT
3. 19 or above on the ACT English Test
