

Measures of Saddleback College's Demographic and Academic Characteristics of Students

2013-2015 (Fall Semesters)

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Executive Summary

Method

Student demographics and academic characteristics data were extracted from the South Orange County Community College District's (SOCCCD) data warehouse, inFORM. The characteristics of three groups of students were examined over the three most recent fall terms: 1) First-Time College, Credit Students, 2) All Credit Students and 3) Non-Credit Students. Credit students were defined as having attempted more than zero units for the given semester while non-credit students attempted zero units. The following demographic and academic metrics were examined across the three groups of students: FTES, age, gender, ethnicity, term units attempted, term units earned, and residence within the District service area. The following cities were identified by the District as being in their service area: Aliso Viejo, Capistrano Beach, Corona Del Mar, Dana Point, East Irvine, El Toro, Foothill Ranch, Irvine, Ladera Ranch, Laguna Beach, Laguna Hills, Laguna Niguel, Laguna Woods, Lake Forest, Mission Viejo, Newport Coast, Rancho Santa Margarita, San Clemente, San Juan Capistrano, Trabuco Canyon, and Tustin. Unless otherwise specified, all analyses refer to the headcount enrollment of students at the college. Missing values were excluded from all total counts.

Findings

Across the last three fall semesters (2013, 2014 and 2015); data suggest that the majority of the student population at Saddleback College is enrolled in credit courses (roughly 72%). Of the credit students enrolled in fall 2015 (n=18,444), 67.5% (n=12,445) were continuing students, 17.1% (n=3,162) were returning from having taken a break between semesters, 13.8% (n=2,545) were first-time college students, and about two percent were concurrent high school students (n=291). The college's non-credit population makes up roughly 28% of its total headcount across the last three fall semesters. In fall 2015, about 78% of the College's non-credit population were students who had continued enrollment from the previous semester.

Credit Students

- This population makes up **72%** of all students attending Saddleback College across the three semesters.
- Comparing fall 2013 to fall 2015, there was a decrease in FTES by 3.7%.
- Students aged **18-21 years** make up the largest group within this population across the three semesters (47%); between fall 2013 to fall 2015, there was a 2.7% decrease in this age group, a key demographic for the college.
- **Female** students comprise roughly 53% of this population; there was a 5.9% decline in female students between fall 2013 and fall 2015.
- **White, Non-Hispanic** students make up roughly 55% of the credit students, but there was a decrease between fall 2013 and fall 2015 (8.4%). Although the mixed ethnicity population makes up 18% of the credit population, they showed an increase between fall 2013 and fall 2015 (5.7%).
- For the last three fall semesters, about 42% of the credit students **attempted less than six units** and 40% earned the same. Although only 20% of the total credit population takes a

full-time load of units (12 units or more), there, however, has been an increase of 7% in this population when comparing fall 2013 and fall 2015.

- Looking across the three fall terms, roughly **86%** of credit students reside in the district service area.

First-Time College, Credit Students

- This population makes up **14%** of all credit students across the three semesters.
- Comparing fall 2013 to fall 2015, the FTES generated by this group has declined by 3.7%.
- Students aged **18-21 years** make up the largest group within this population across the three semesters (78%); comparing fall 2013 to fall 2015, there was a 7.6% decrease in this age range.
- **Male** students comprise roughly 53% of this population although there has been a 5.5% decline between fall 2013 and fall 2015.
- **White, Non-Hispanic** students make up 54% of the first-time college, credit students; but there has been a decrease between fall 2013 and fall 2015 (-8.1%).
- For the last three fall semesters, about 68% of the first-time college, credit students **attempted less than 12 units** and roughly 70% earned the same.
- Roughly **91%** of first-time college, credit students reside in the district service area across the three semesters.
- Roughly **40%** of first-time college, credit students attended the following five high schools: Aliso Niguel HS, Trabuco Hills HS, San Clemente HS, Capistrano Valley HS, and Dana Hills HS across the three semesters. The largest decrease between fall 2013 and fall 2015 was Capistrano Valley HS (-20.6%).

Non-Credit Students

- This population makes up about **30%** of all students attending Saddleback College across the three fall semesters.
- Across the three semesters, roughly 80% of the non-credit population were students with continuous enrollment (no breaks between semesters)
- Comparing fall 2013 to fall 2015, there was a 2.1% decrease in FTES generated by this demographic segment.
- Students **over the age of 59 years old** make up the largest group within non-credit population across the three semesters (67%); comparing fall 2013 to fall 2015, there has been a 7.7% increase in this age range.
- **Female** students comprise roughly 70% of this population although there has been a 3.5% increase among the male students between fall 2013 and fall 2015.
- This key demographic is largely **White, Non-Hispanic** (66%), but there has been a notable increase in the Hispanic/Latino population between fall 2013 and fall 2015 (57.1%).
- Roughly **95%** of non-credit students reside in the district service area.

Conclusion

The analysis of student demographics for Credit Students, First-Time College Credit Students, and the Non-Credit population reveals some interesting trends. Among the credit population, FTES has declined by 4% over the last three terms. First-time college students make

up roughly 14% of the college's credit population in any given fall term. Between fall 2013 and fall 2015, the FTES generated by this key demographic declined by nearly four percent. Within the first-time college category, students aged 18-21 years declined by nearly 8% over the last three terms. With respect to the non-credit group, FTES over the last three terms has declined by 2.1%.

These analysis reveal that the college is a predominantly, white and younger campus with a significant segment of Emeritus students. In addition, first-time students are, on average, enrolling in fewer units. Further examination of the data is needed but this trend could indicate that the mix of first-time students may be shifting away from "direct from high school" to those students who have taken a year or two off between high school and college. Further examination of the data is necessary in order to determine whether the demographic changes revealed in this report may necessitate adjustments to college programs and services or recruitment strategies. The college should continue to monitor the population trends and college going rates among these key demographic segments.

Enrollment Status of Credit Students

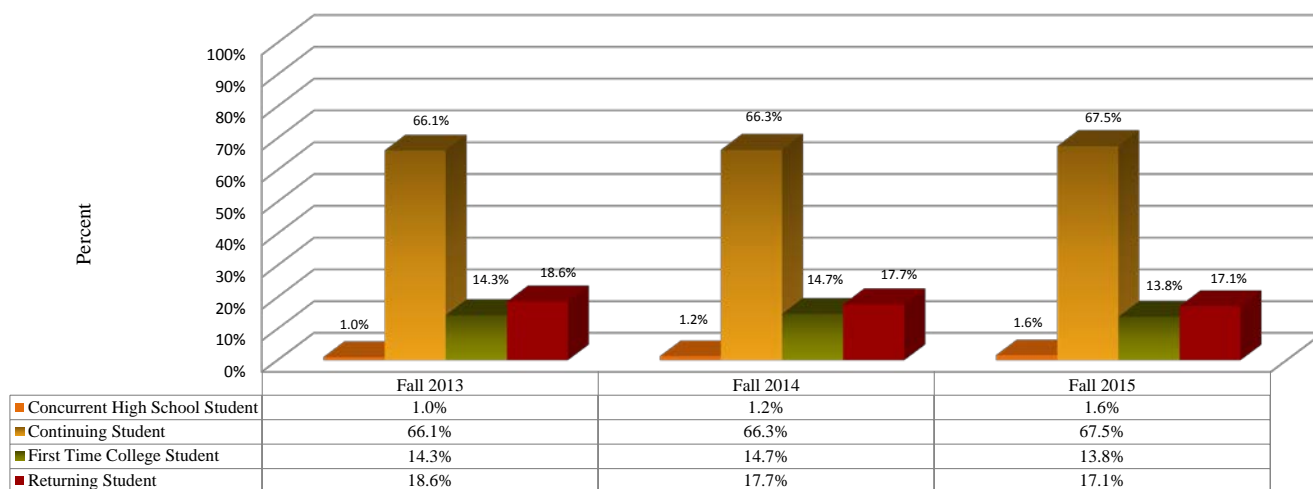

FTES of Credit Students

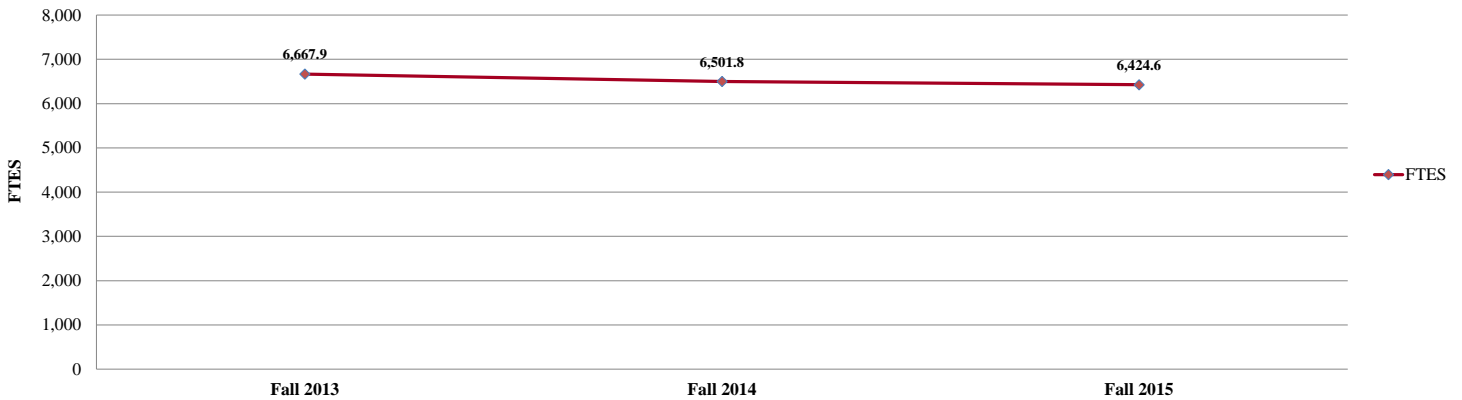

Age Distribution of Credit Students

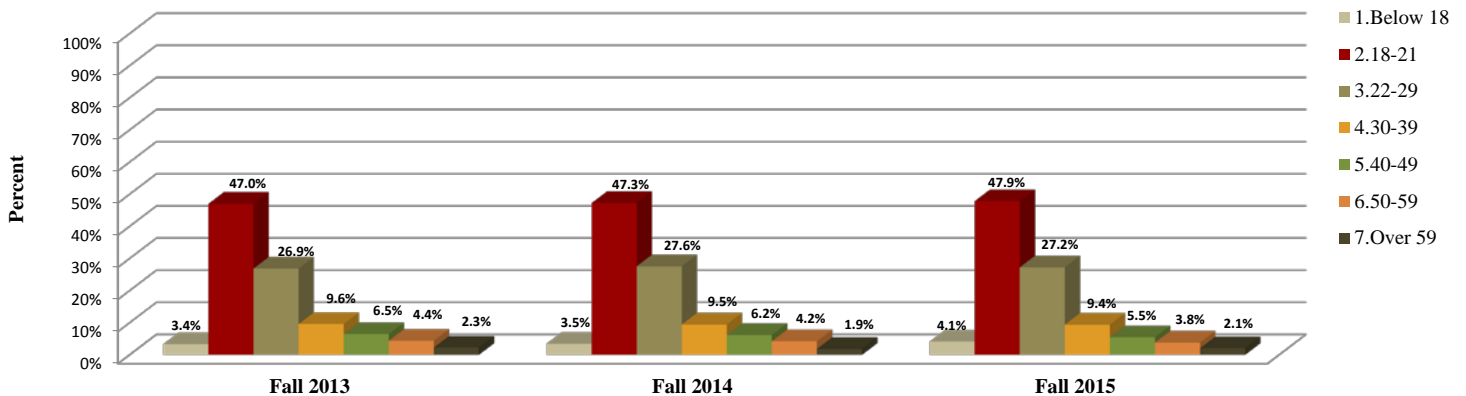

Gender Distribution of Credit Students

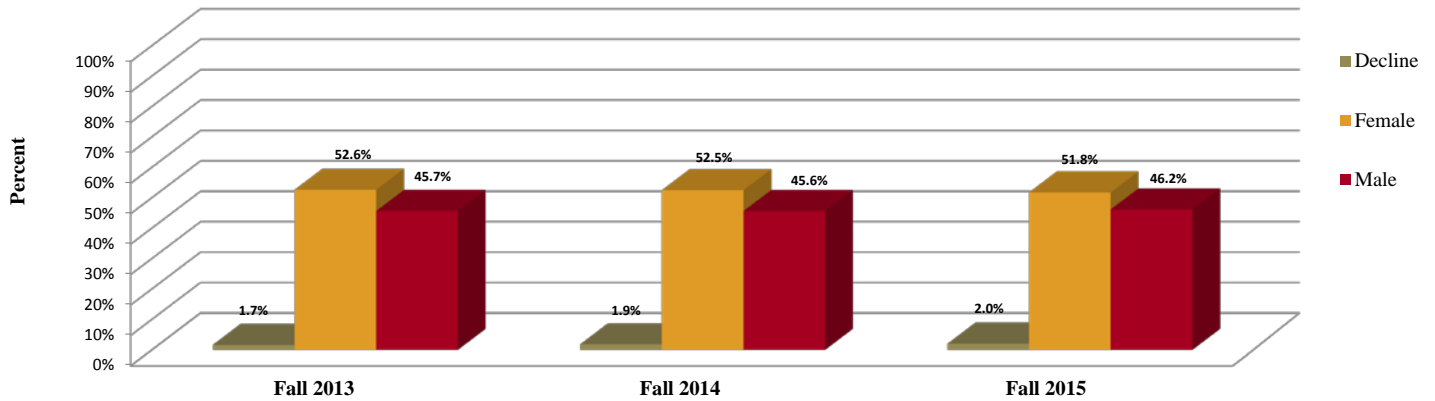

Ethnic Distribution of Credit Students

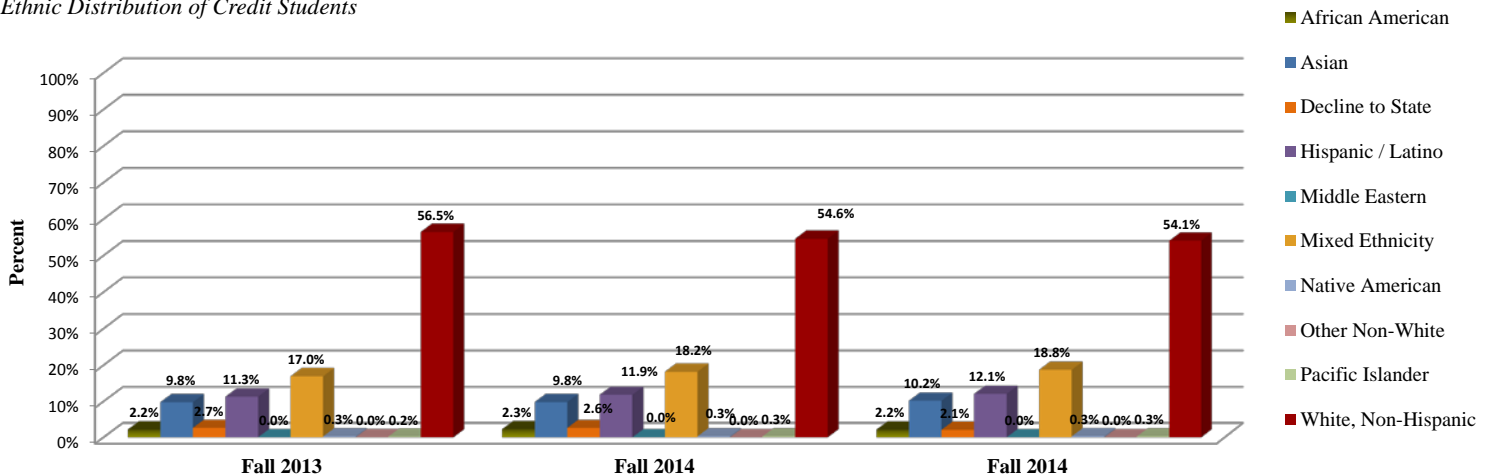
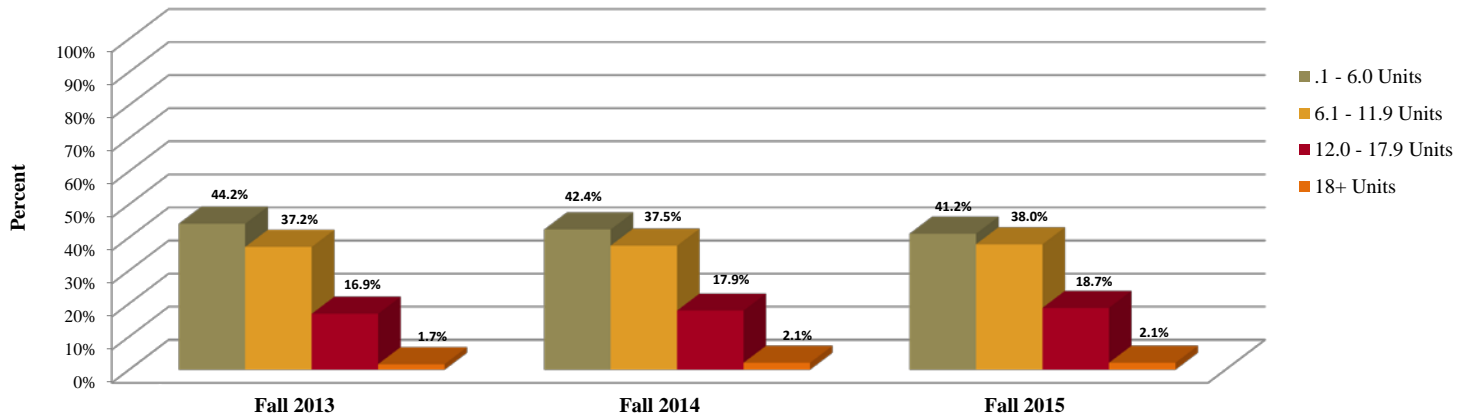

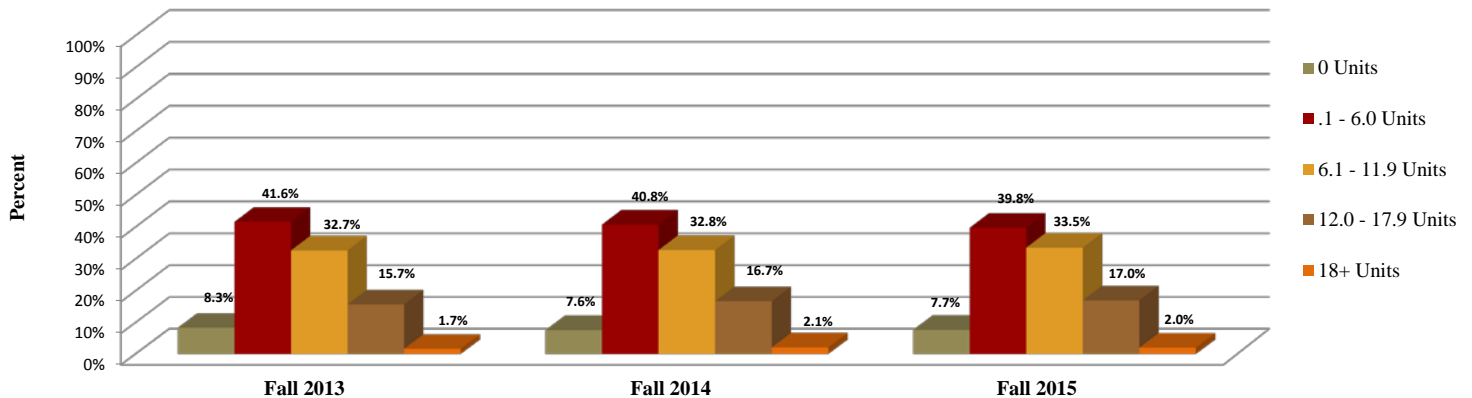
Chart 9*Term Units Earned by Credit Students*

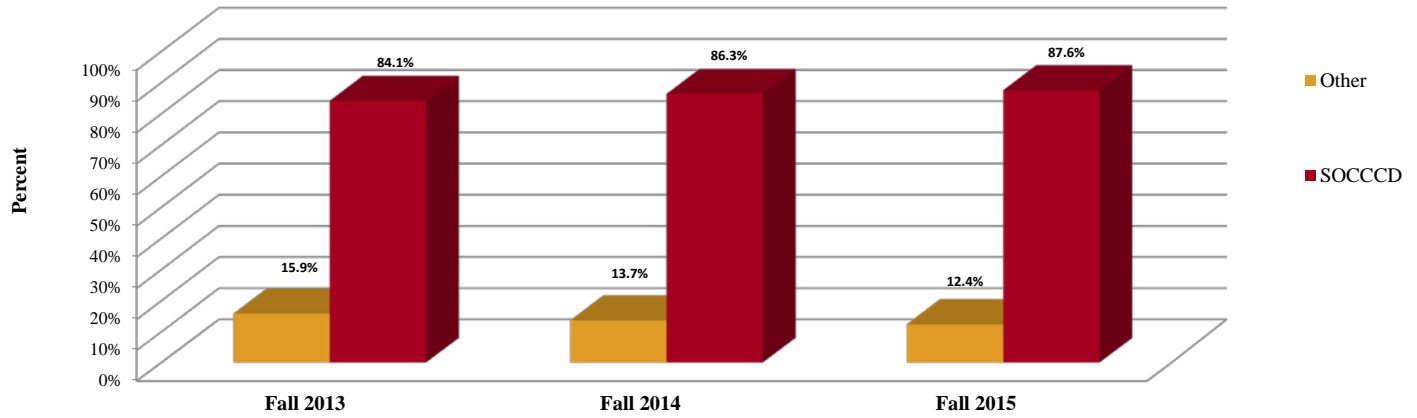

Enrollment Status of Credit Students

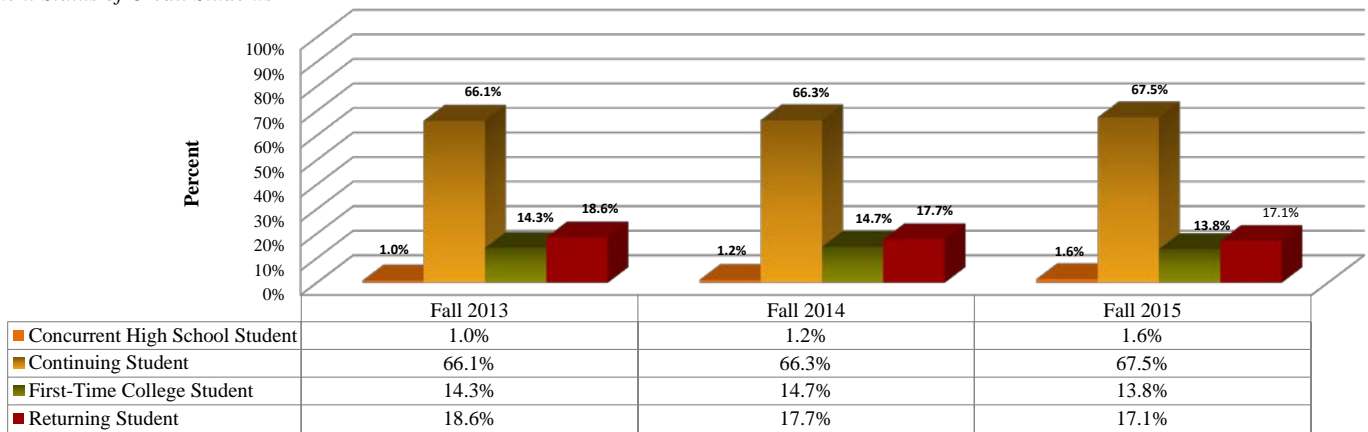

FTES of First-Time College, Credit Students

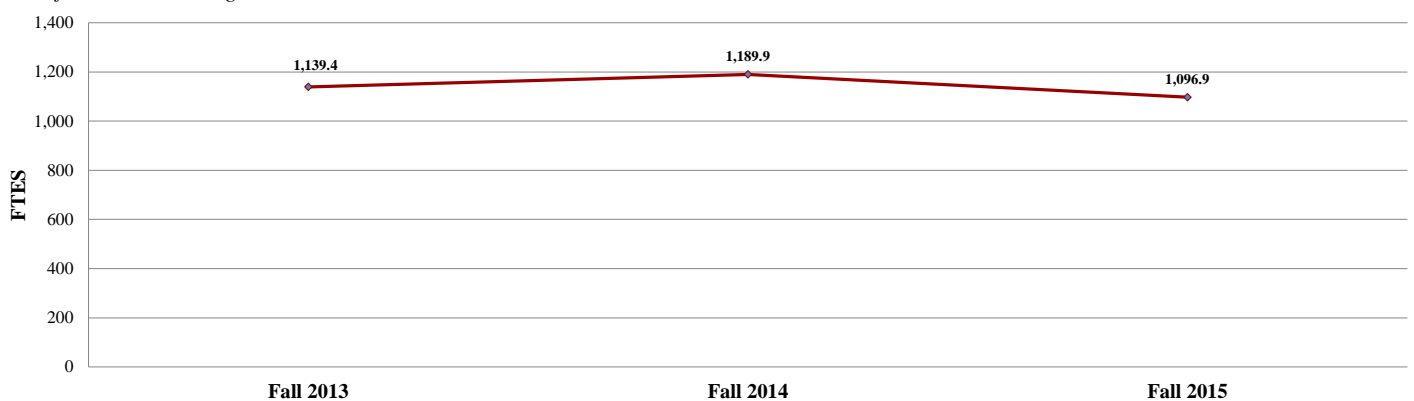

Age Distribution of First-Time College, Credit Students

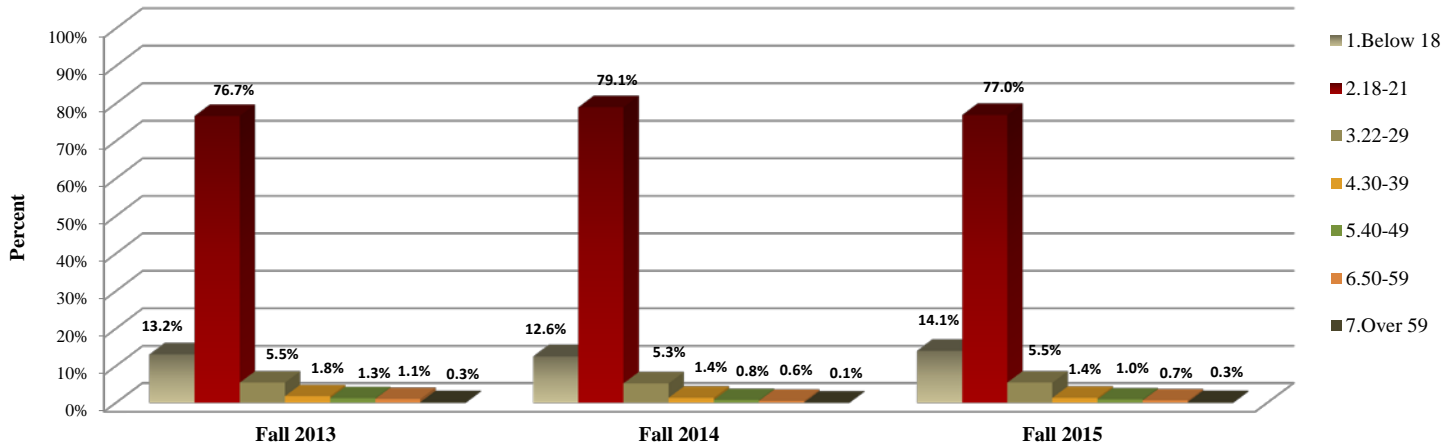

Gender Distribution of First-Time College, Credit Students

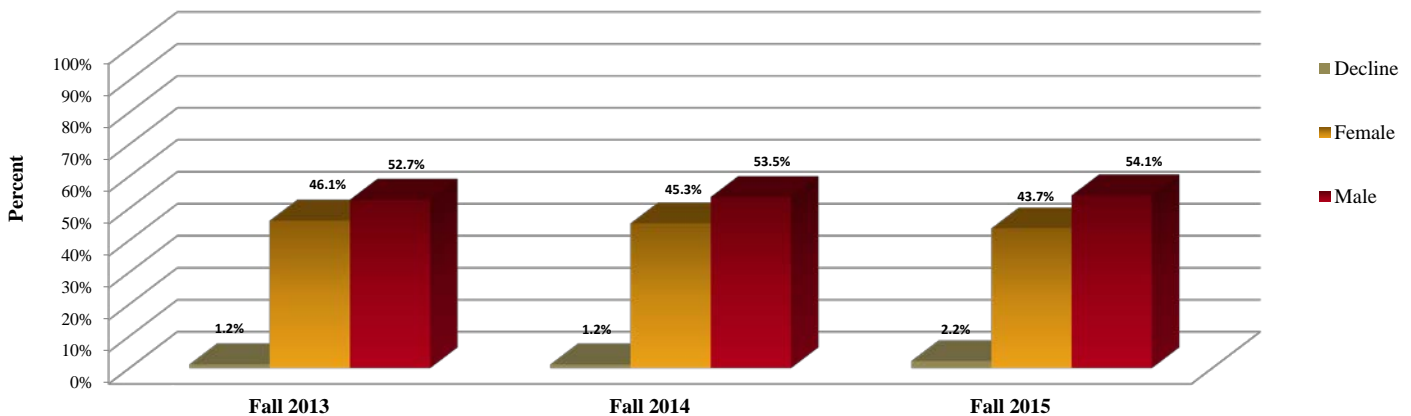
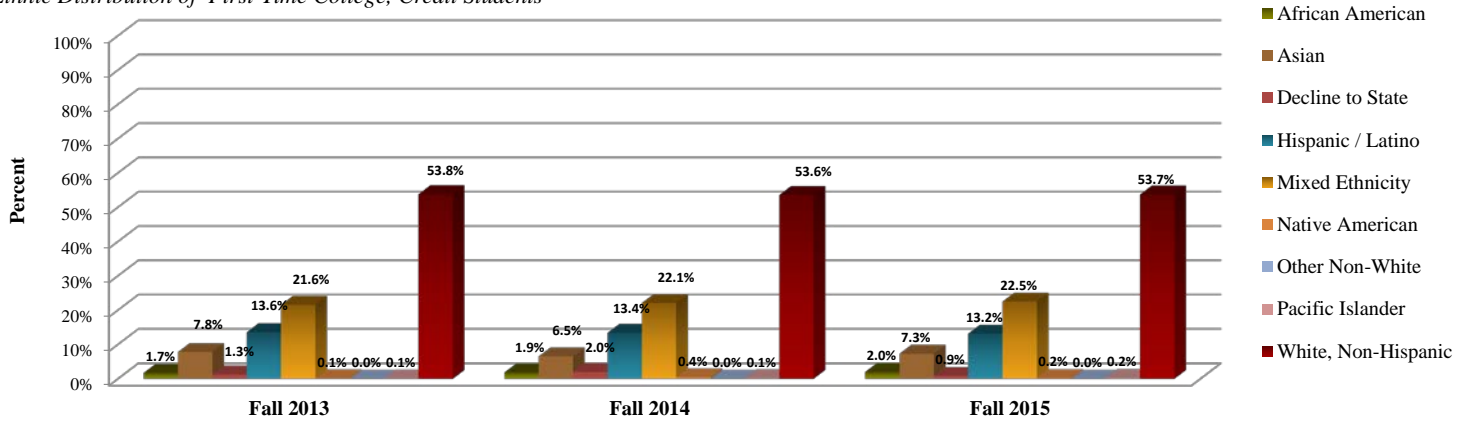

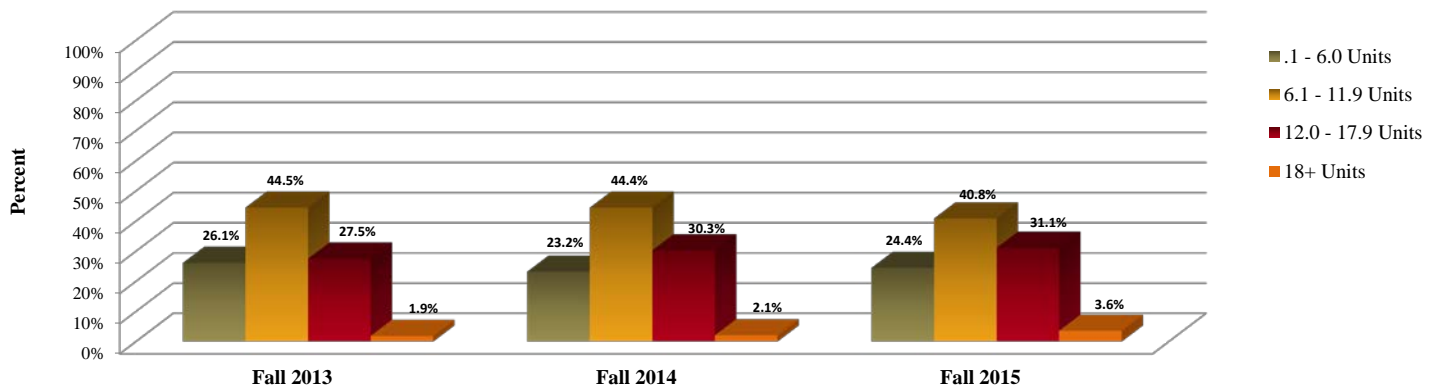
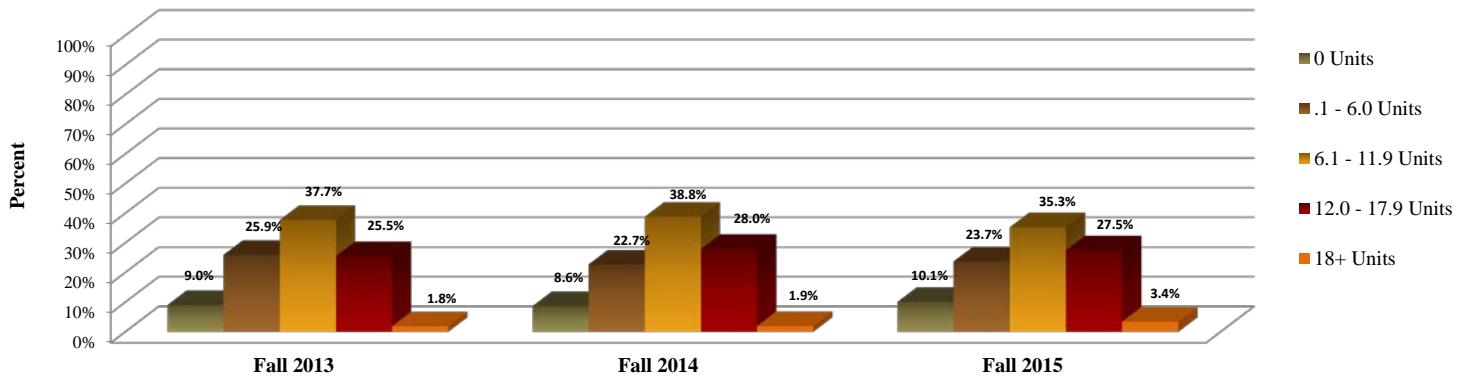
Chart 16*Term Units Attempted by First-Time College, Credit Students*

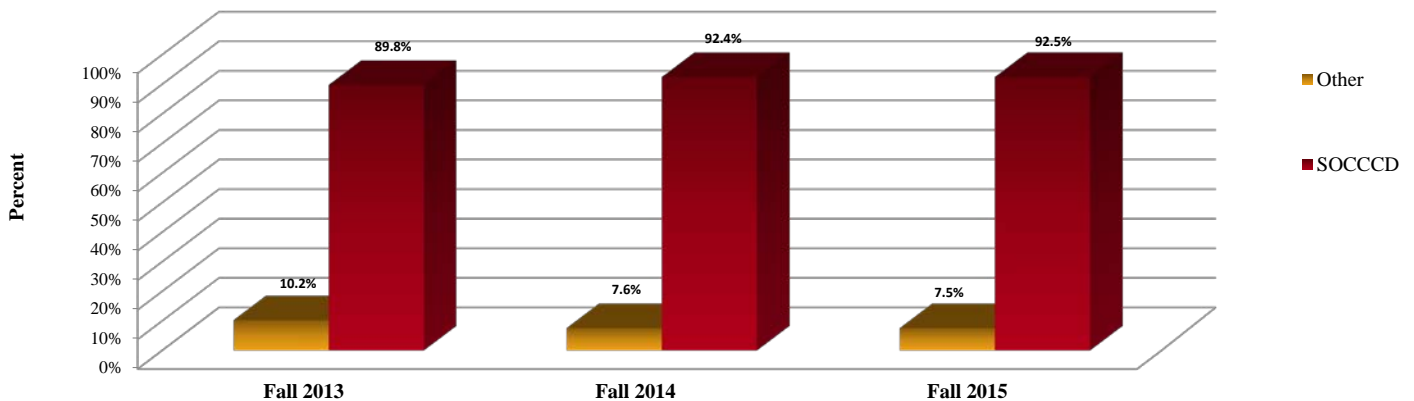
Chart 18*Residence of First-Time College, Credit Students within South Orange County Community College District (SOCCCD)*

Enrollment Status of Non-Credit Students

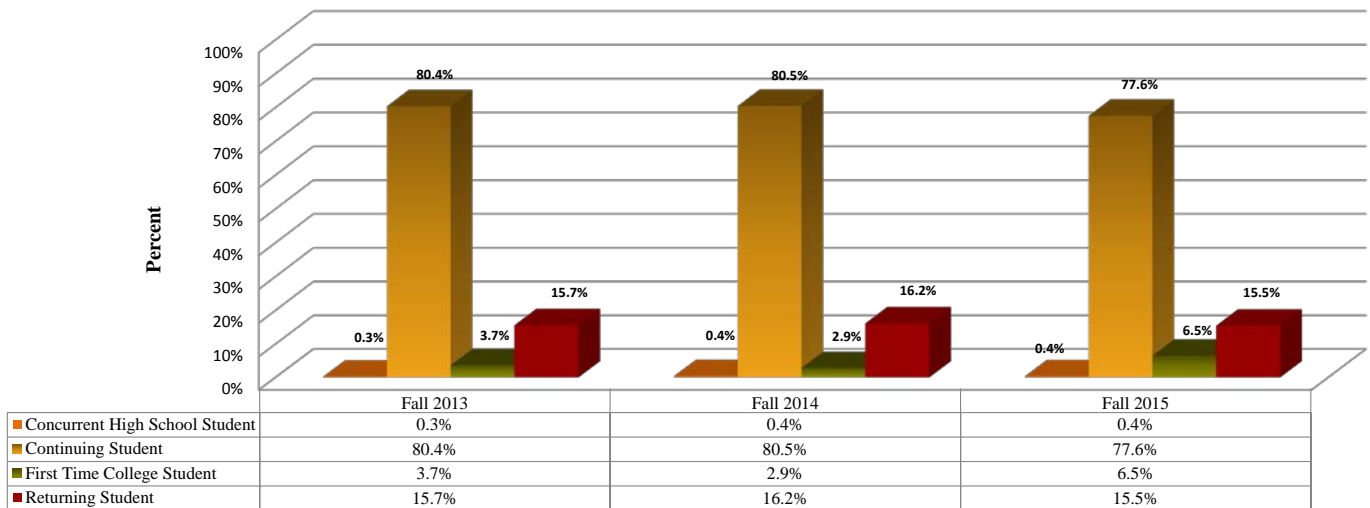

FTES of Non-Credit Students

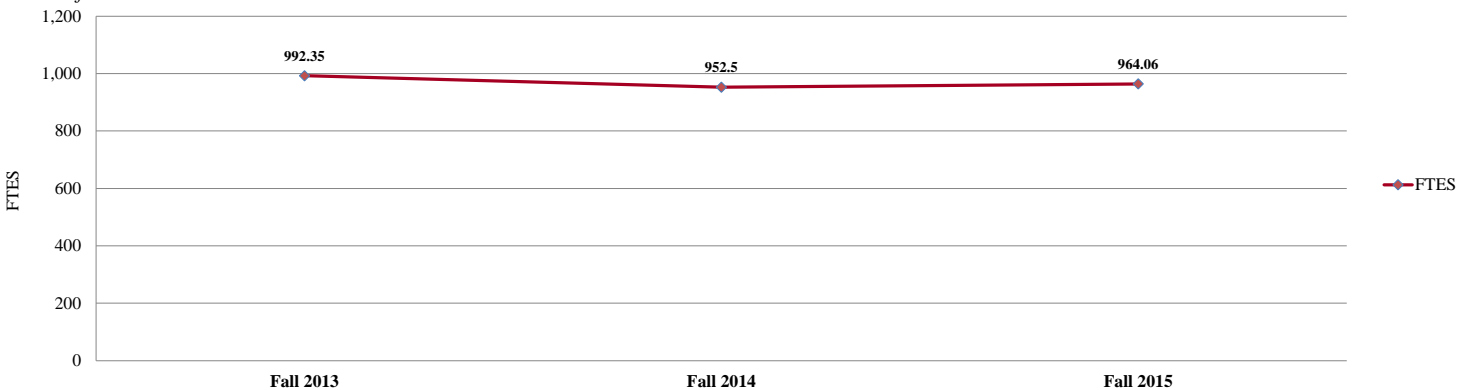
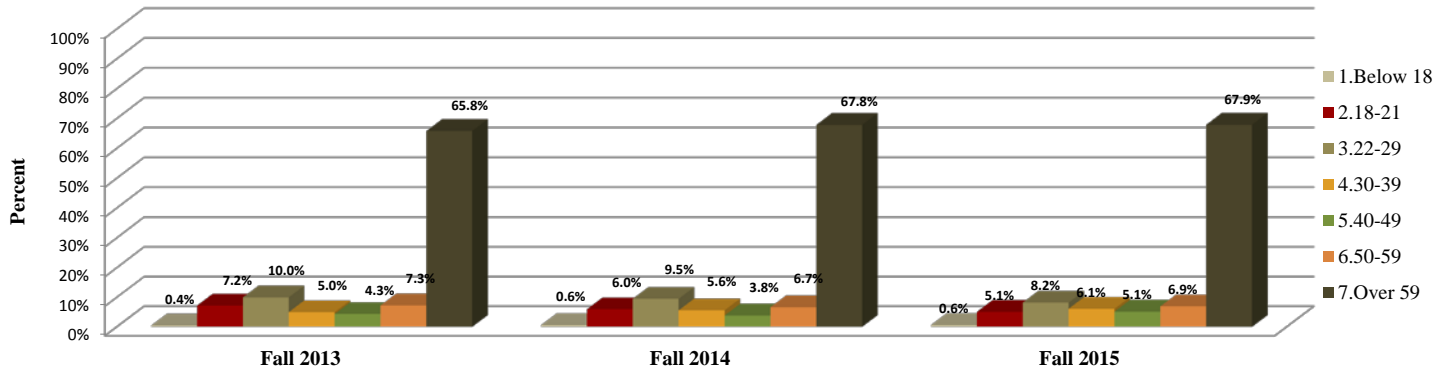

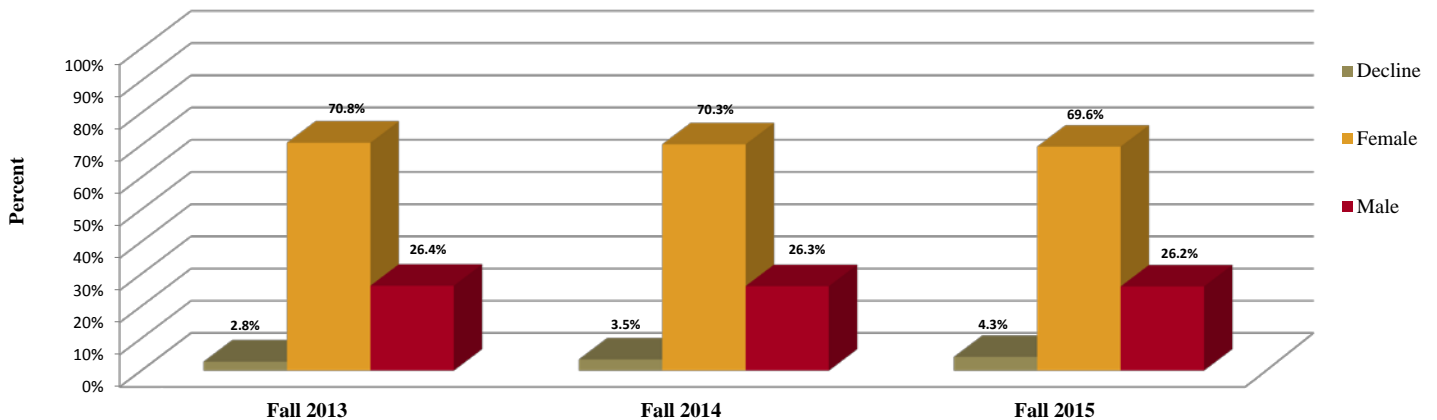
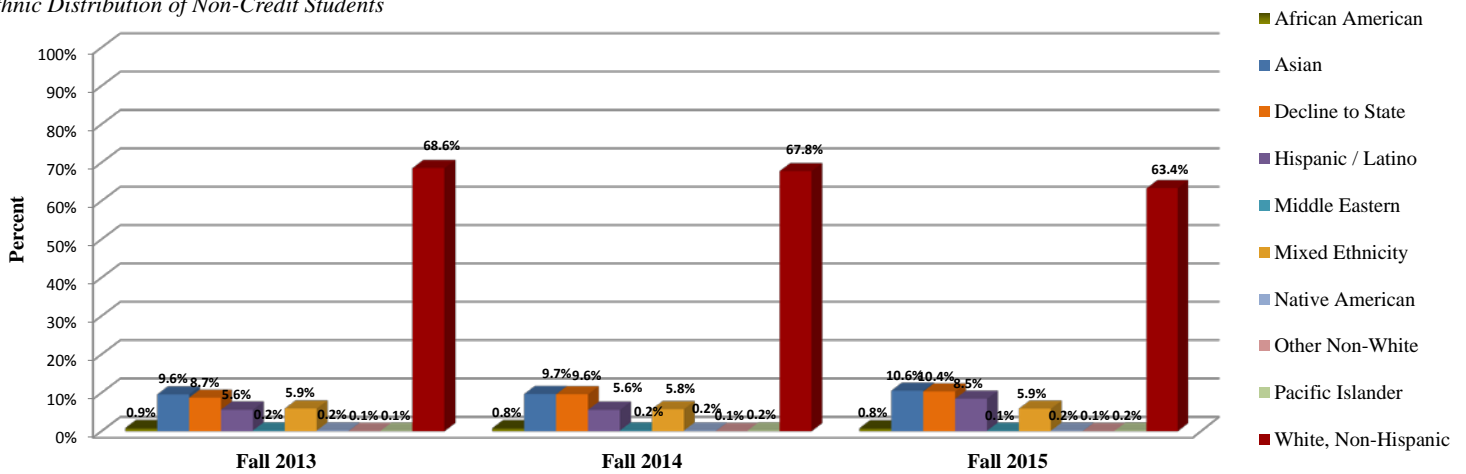
Chart 23*Gender Distribution of Non-Credit Students*
