California Assembly Bill 1705 will require mathematics departments to re-evaluate their placement practices, particularly for students who are required to take calculus for their major. The math department needs a low-unit support option to help under-prepared students succeed in first-semester calculus. A similar model of support has been implemented successfully via Math 224S, 208S, and 210S at Saddleback; we now need this type of corequisite support for Math 3A to address student needs, statewide best-practices, and potential legislative requirements. 6.
