NOTE: Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T) require completion of CSUGE or IGETC. Complete major requirements as listed in the College Catalog. A "C" grade or better or a "P" (pass) for major courses is required. Have 12 units completed in residency at Saddleback College. Complete a minimum of 60 degree applicable units with an overall 2.0 grade point average in all units attempted. Degree applicable units are numbered 1-299. NOTE: Only courses numbered 1-199 are applicable towards the Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T).
