# **ASSOCIATE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

To earn an Associate Degree at Saddleback College, students must meet the following requirements:

Complete ONE of the General Education patterns: Saddleback College General Education OR California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC).

NOTE: To earn an Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T), Cal-GETC must be completed, minimum "C" grade or better or a "P" (pass) is required.

Complete major requirements as listed in the College Catalog. A "C" grade or better or a "P" (pass) is required.

Complete 12 units in residency.

Complete a minimum of 60 degree applicable units with an overall 2.0 grade point average in all units attempted.

#### Note to student

- Courses numbered 1-199 as well as Common Course Numbering (CXXXX) are degree applicable towards Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T). For more course numbering information please visit https://saddleback.currigunet.com/catalog/ig/21685/25189.
- Courses numbered 1-299 as well as Common Course Numbering (CXXXX) at Saddleback are degree applicable towards the AA and AS degree. For course numbering information, please visit https://saddleback.curriqunet.com/catalog/ig/21685/25189.
- · Check with transfer institution for their admissions/transfer policy as they may not be aligned with Cal-GETC.
- High school students must consult with transfer institution regarding completion of Cal-GETC prior to high school graduation. TAG is not available to high school students who graduate
  and apply directly to a UC campus.
- Course credit may be accepted from institution and colleges that are designated as Institutional accreditors toward Saddleback College Associate degrees and certificates only.
- Transfer credit including Cal-GETC and Associate Degrees for Transfer is only accepted if from an approved Regional accreditor (see below).
- Coursework from Irvine Valley College or other community colleges with the same course number and/or title may NOT always be certified in the same category at Saddleback College
  for Cal-GETC. Also, similar coursework from accredited independent or private colleges or out-of-state institutions will NOT always be certified unless the course content is deemed
  comparable to community college courses approved for Cal-GETC.
- Students wishing to use a course to meet Cal-GETC requirement MUST be sure that the course is on the list during the academic year when it is taken. While completion of 60
  transferable units including all Cal-GETC certification requirements will satisfy CSU and/or UC admission requirements, transfer admission is not guaranteed. Competitive campuses or
  majors for which more applications are received than can be accommodated, may screen for admissions based on meeting application deadlines, courses required in preparation for
  the major and/or grade point average.

## **General information**

Completion of the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College (CCC) to a California State University (CSU) and/or University of California (UC) campus or program without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. For most students, it is strongly recommended that they complete Cal-GETC prior to transfer. All CSUs and most UC campuses and programs will accept certified Cal-GETC completion as satisfying lower-division general education requirements. Some UC colleges and majors within the UC campus may not accept or recommend Cal-GETC to fulfill all of their general education requirements. Completion of the Cal-GETC is not an admission requirement or admission guarantee for transfer to the CSU or UC, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower-division, general education requirements for students at the CSU or UC. It is however required for conferral of an Associate Degree for Transfers (ADT: AA-T/AS-T). There is no limit on the number of external exams (Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate) that can be applied to Cal-GETC. External exams may be used regardless of when the exam was taken. Cal-GETC certification does not determine applicability towards meeting program requirements at the receiving institution. College Level Examination Program (CLEP) and other College Board and ACT exams (SAT I/II, Subject Tests, Achievement Tests) cannot be used for Cal-GETC. Please see CSU systemwide Credit for External Examinations resource below.

Students who initially enroll at a UC campus, then leave and attend a community college, and subsequently return to the same campus are considered "readmits" by the UC. Such students cannot use Cal-GETC. CSU does not have a system-wide policy that addresses these students and/or this reverse-transfer situation and thus there is no prohibition on use of Cal-GETC for students returning to the CSU from a CCC. There is no limit on the number of external exams that can be applied to Cal-GETC. Certification of coursework completed for Cal-GETC will be honored provided that a course was on a college's approved Cal-GETC list when it was completed. Although California Community College courses may be listed in more than one area, they can only be applied to one area during Cal-GETC certification for each individual student. A "C-" grade valued at less than 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale cannot be used for Cal-GETC certification. No more than 14 semester units (21 quarter units) of Pass/No Pass (Credit/No Credit), excluding credit by examination, may be used toward Cal-GETC certification. Language other than English (LOTE) is not apart of Cal-GETC certification. U.S. History, Constitution, and American Ideals (Al) is a CSU graduation requirement that maybe certified however not required: POLS C1000/C1000H (formerly PS 1/1H) and HIST 16, 17, or 22.
