- 1. Meeting called to order at 3:06 p.m.; quorum achieved.
- 2. Consent Agenda
  - February 20, 2025, Meeting Minutes

- 3. Board Development Committee Elizabeth McCann
  - Cara Davidoff had a baby boy and his name is Harrison.
  - The Board Development Committee will resume meeting this summer.
- 4. Finance Committee Updates Anthony Ferry
  - Finance report was good.
  - Market volitivity, driven by tariffs, continues.
  - Have seen a 10% market correction, but the diversity of the portfolio is standing up to it.
  - International markets outperformed and fixed income is good.
  - Two funds under review, but other than this, staying the course. No significant actions taken.
  - Funds have reached the \$10 million mark.
- 5. Faculty Representative Report Dr. Morgan Barrows
  - Busy period implementing multi-factor authentication and dealing with Banner transitions for faculty course scheduling.
  - Have a new round of six tenured faculty.
  - Working on Al.
  - Scholarship application review concluded.
  - Commencement is just around the corner.
  - The One Book/One College author will speak next Wednesday at noon in McKinney Theatre.

- 6. Associated Student Government Kristian Suazo
  - ASG had an increase in voting this year and is in the process of transitioning to the new officers.
    - o The new ASG president is Noah Aguilar.
  - The ASAC Conference is in March.
    - We will be advocating on the protections of FAFSA and advocating against Department of Education cuts.
  - Three members will be going to a conference in Oakland to talk about the China trip.
  - Will be holding a fundraiser to support Glendale Community College, affected by the Eaton Fire.
- 7. Classified Senate Report Erlynne Ballo
  - Classified Development Day was well attended.
    - o Workshops were hosted by classified personnel.
    - Folks want to be involved again. We have not seen these participant numbers since before the pandemic.
  - Georgina Martinez is the incoming president.
  - The Transfer Fair is happening today.
  - We will be able to award a Classified Student Scholarship this year and planning on raising more money for future scholarships.
- 8. Board of Trustees Report Trustee Lisa Bartlett
  - Proposing to send out a newsletter to keep the community apprised of everything going on by the Trustees and to keep people engaged.
    - Will send it out once a month to highlight the wonderful things happening and establish relationships.
    - Will report back after speaking to the Trustees about this project.
- 9. President's Report Dr. Elliot Stern
  - Sent out a magazine to all residents in the area in fall.
  - Implementing MFA, multi-factor authentication, for 55,000 students.
  - Transitioning to Banner's Enterprise Student Information System with big launches in the next couple of months.
    - o First launch will be to classified users, next faculty users, then all users.
  - Under the new government regime, we have seen Federal funds and grants lost.
  - Federal Immigration Policy
    - Student visas lost for students with a criminal past.
    - Saddleback has not been affected.
    - o IVC had several students affected.
  - Wrapping up the academic year.
  - Recovered from the pandemic.
    - Reached a 57-year record on enrollment with 28,600 students, includes 300 international students.
    - o One half of Emeritus students are online with 36 satellite locations for in-classroom learning.
  - Students' needs survey
    - Have taken a passive survey and turned it around.
    - o It is not anonymous.
    - Departments reach out to the students.
    - 3,000 students responded with each having at least three needs. Saved 180 students that could have left Saddleback.
  - The new Culinary and Auto Tech buildings at ATEP in Tustin will open in August.
  - Math and Computer Science Building will have a January ribbon cutting.
  - Mars Rover Project team was invited to Utah to compete in the finals on May 28th.
  - Discover Saddleback will take place on the quad on April 22.
  - Monday at 2:00 p.m. we will hold a live stream talk on Al.
  - Elizabeth McCann has been working on her dissertation and successfully defended it yesterday.

- o She contributed to a concrete policy on regulation of athletes.
- 10. Foundation Report Dr. Elizabeth McCann
  - March 15 was the RX3 fundraiser/partnership event.
    - o Gift increased to \$100,000 this year.
  - April 3rd is the softball field ribbon cutting.
  - Scholarship Ceremony is May 15 at 2:00 p.m.
