## ASSOCIATE IN ARTS IN ELEMENTARY TEACHER EDUCATION FOR TRANSFER DEGREE

### To be awarded the Associate Degree for Transfer, students must complete:

1. A minimum of 60 CSU-transferable semester units, which includes the 58 units listed below.
2. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0.
3. Certified completion of the California State University General Education- Breadth pattern (CSU GE Breadth) OR the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern.
4. A minimum of 12 units must be completed at Saddleback College.

Note: All courses below must be completed with a grade of C or better. A “P” (pass) designation may be used instead of a letter grade, but not all transfer institutions will accept courses with a “P.”
