COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Examination of computer information systems and their role in business including computer hardware and software, communications and networking concepts, programming techniques, e-commerce, ethics and security, database management systems, Internet usage, and system and application software. Students apply these concepts and methods through hands-on projects to develop computer-based solutions to business problems.

2. Describe the functions and uses of the hardware and software comprising a computer system.
3. Utilize program features to create, edit, format, print, save and retrieve personal and business documents.

1. Describe existing and emerging technologies and their impact on organizations and society.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the development and use of information systems in business.
3. Demonstrate the ability to solve common business problems using appropriate Information Technology applications and systems, including spreadsheet and database software, and Internet technologies.
4. Demonstrate the ability to apply Internet security concepts when using Internet technologies, including email, World Wide Web, chat, instant messaging, podcasts, video, internet search, uploading and downloading, blogs, social networking, and e-commerce.

5. Define terms that are unique to the field of computers and information systems.
6. Describe the functions and uses of the hardware and software comprising a computer system.
7. Describe computer ethics, crime, and security.
8. Demonstrate the ability to locate, evaluate, synthesize, use, and communicate information in its various formats.
9. Compile a portfolio of computer-based, problem-solving, business related computer projects.

Information Competency Paper (25 points)

CIM 1 fulfills the Saddleback College requirement for information competency. The paper you will submit for this will require you to define, research, evaluate and make recommendations on an issue as it relates to computer technology. Please submit a one page, double-spaced paper to be submitted to Blackboard in .doc or .docx format by 11:59 p.m. on **March 12 (last day of class)**. **Information competency papers submitted to Blackboard must be original works and written in your own words. If you use any information from another source, credit must be given to the author.**

Lab:

(3) Excel and (3) Access chapter simulation assignments in MyITLab. You will access MyITLab through a link in Blackboard (Tools – MyITLab). Two simulation trainings and a grader project (100 points for each grader project) will be completed in MyITLab for each chapter.

Grader Projects: Completed in MyITLab at end of each Excel and Access chapter. Each student must download the starter file and complete the project with Excel 2016 or Access 2016. Three attempts are allowed to be submitted for each grader project prior to the due date and the highest grade will be recorded in the Gradebook. The completed grader project file that is submitted must match the starter file or the submission will be flagged as a Potential Integrity Violation. All parties involved in this violation will receive a zero for the project.

Final Grade

A = 90%, B = 80%, C = 70%, D = 60% of total points for MyITlab assignments, Discussion Board Introduction, and Information Competency paper.

Pass/No Pass – Students enrolled in this course for Pass/No Pass must receive 70% or more of the total possible points to receive credit.
